You Could Make a Difference

**Seventy-two disciples! Who were they?
Where were they from?**

St. Luke doesn't answer our questions. But the Gospel-truth is that seventy-two people accepted Jesus' challenge and set to work as missionaries - setting out in pairs as messengers of peace, healing and hope.

"The seventy two came back rejoicing", St. Luke tells us. And surely Jesus must have shared their joy. The seventy-two ordinary folk had achieved a victory beyond their wildest dreams. Mission accomplished.

Could such a success be repeated in our time? If Jesus walked into our church today and said I want help from you people - seventy-two are needed. If He said *"I want you to bring peace to your homes, to give encouragement to the depressed, to speak words of comfort and consolation to the lonely. I want you to be angels of mercy"*.

Just pause for a moment and try to appreciate how much need there is out there - so much pessimism, dejection and fear, afflicting our time.

And then remember we have the Good News.

"If Jesus walked into our Church today?"

But of course we know that He is present with us and that He is in fact urgently looking for helpers.

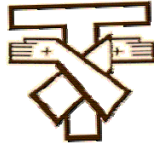

Gospel Luke 10:1-12.17-20

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road. Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if people of peace live there, your peace will go and rest on them; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house. Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you"
