The Baptism of the Lord (Year C) 13th January, 2019

Sundays:

"The Blessed Sacraments"

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of our Lord Jesus Christ by John in the River Jordan. At the Feast of the Epiphany which we celebrated last Sunday, at the Baptism of Our Lord, and at the Marriage Feast in Cana, we are told that Jesus let his glory be seen and that people believed in Him. Jesus is revealed to us not just as another human being but as the Son of God, The Light of the World who has come to save us and to show us the way.

As we celebrate Christ's baptism it affords us the opportunity to reflect on our own baptism and on the sacraments in our church. There are Seven Sacraments, Baptism, Confirmation, Penance, The Eucharist, Marriage, Ordination and the Sacrament of the Sick.

When we are Baptised we are given the right to receive all of the other Sacraments. There is a big tie-up between the Sacrament of Baptism and the Sacrament of Confirmation. When a baby is baptised it has no idea what is being promised on its behalf. It is in being brought up in a Catholic family and learning about Jesus and His way at school that the child confirms the promises made for it at Baptism.

What is involved then in receiving any Sacrament is that we have a solemn promise to live in a Christian way and the Sacrament is the living out of that promise. The living out of this promise will have a huge effect in our church and on humanity.

It is true to say in recent times many people have been abusing the Sacraments. In many instances they are used in order to have a family celebration or get-together and the promises made are largely forgotten.

There are many children who are Baptised and the next time they see the Church is when they are preparing for 1st Holy Communion or Confirmation. It is also true to say that many of our young people who make their Confirmation and commit themselves to the way of Christ are rarely to be seen in Church until they maybe getting married or are there for Christmas time.

It is the promise that we make and the living out of it that is important. We all have to ask ourselves of how true we are to our commitments and how much we really respect the Sacraments.

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity Friday 18th—25th January

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity 2019 has been prepared by Christians from Indonesia. With a population of 265 million, about 10% of Indonesians are Christian from various traditions. There is a great diversity of ethnicity, language and religion. There are also tensions affecting politics, business, justice, wealth and polverty. Christian communities in such an environment become newly aware of their unity as they join in a common concern and a common response to an unjust reality. At the same time, confronted by these injustices, we are obliged, as Christians, to examine the ways in which we are complicit. Only by heeding Jesus' prayer 'that they all may be one' can we witness to living unity in diversity. It is through our unity in Christ that we will be able to combat injustice and serve the needs of its victims. Moved by these concerns, the Christians of Indonesia found that the words of Deuteronomy, 'Justice, and only justice, you shall pursue' (see Deut 16:18-20) spoke powerfully to their situation and needs. As individual Christians and communities, we are called together to form a united witness for justice and to be a means of Christ's healing grace for the brokenness of the world.

Today we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of Our Lord in the Jordan. When Jesus came out of the water the heavens were opened and the Spirit of God descended like a dove and alighted on Him. And a voice from heaven said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved, with him I am well pleased. Listen to him.' (Mark 1:11) Jesus accepted His Father's will and began His public life which would end on Calvary.

There is a close connection between the baptism of Christ and our baptism. We were baptised in the name of the Blessed Trinity. Every Christian has a special call in life. The spirit of God ought to be visible in our outlook and behaviour as we serve God's people. We can recite this prayer: *May Father, Son and Holy Spirit enfold us day and night, on the seashore, or on mountain high. Amen*
