The Sermon on the Plain

Jesus and His newly chosen twelve have just come down from the mountain where the apostles had their first experience of Jesus in deep communion with God. Now on the plain where people lived and worked Jesus delivered His sermon to his disciples.

Jesus himself had experienced the poverty of being rejected by his own people in His own town and by the religious leaders. He knew the hunger of longing to free people from oppression but of being objected to and not being listened to. He now tells His disciples that if they are going to spread His message of love they also will experience the same poverty and hunger. But they will also know deep union with God.

Luke reflected deeply on the words of Jesus and then applied them to the situation in his own community. His community is suffering because of the rejection they are experiencing at the hands of their own Jewish brothers and sisters, They are opposing the liberating love of Jesus because the powerful among them want to maintain unjust structures that support their own life styles. Luke shared his own inspired insights into the mind and heart of Jesus and gave them to his community in the form of blessings and love.

The same words of Jesus are spoken to us today in the Gospel. The teaching of Jesus always implies a call. What is the glaring call from Jesus to us today?

What makes your heart hunger to make the liberating love of Jesus active in your own life and in the lives of others.

Blessed are they who hunger for what is just and right for they shall have their fill of communion with God.
