Forgiveness and Love

We are all human and we can all make mistakes and need forgiveness.

These mistakes lead to disagreement, resentment, sorrow, or a sense of betrayal. But forgiveness is human too. To forgive does not mean that you condone wrongdoing.

If someone has hurt or betrayed you it takes a bigger person to forgive and let go of any hatred or resentment. You cannot control how other people may hurt you but you can control how you deal with it.

Though it can feel very comforting or powerfully releasing to be forgiven, make no mistake, we do not forgive for the other person; we forgive for ourselves.

Forgiveness is for our own growth and happiness. When we hold on to hurt, pain, resentment, and anger it harms us far more than it harms the offender.

Forgiveness frees us to live in the present. Reliving the wrong that was done to us keeps us living in the past and missing today's beauty.

You may think of God as the final dispenser of forgiveness, but we too have the power to forgive. We may find it difficult at times to pray the Our Father: "And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."

God stands ready and willing to forgive us, but asks that we extend the same forgiveness to others first. If we have resentment and bitterness in our hearts, it's time to give it over to God.

Let Him heal us and give us the ability to forgive. Only with the power of God and the Holy Spirit working in our lives can we love and forgive others.


