LOVE THAT SEES IN THE DARK

Easter began for Jesus in the darkness of the tomb when God raised Him to life in the light of the resurrection.

Love plays a very important part in this Easter story.

It was love that brought Mary Magdalene to the tomb in the dark before the dawn. On seeing the stone rolled back she interpreted it wrongly and ran to tell the apostles about her fears.

It was love that made them run to the tomb. On entering the tomb Peter saw things just as they were and was amazed at the empty tomb.

But the beloved disciple saw more than discarded clothes and he believed. His love for Jesus was so strong that he could see through the dark and grasp the truth to be the first to believe in the resurrection. Love can often see the truth when the mind is uncertain.

The empty tomb was seen by three people and the response of each was different. For Peter it was a puzzle. For the beloved disciple it led to belief. For Mary Magdalene her loving watch at the tomb led her to seeing the risen Christ and to be commissioned by him to proclaim the resurrection to His disciples.

Where am I in this Easter story?

We have all been baptised into union with Christ. Am I like Peter just amazed and puzzled? Am I like the beloved disciple so lovingly united to Christ that I can look forward in hope to sharing with Him in the joy of the resurrection? Or am I like Mary Magdalene? Do I experience the embrace of God's love so strongly that I feel called and commissioned to spread the message of that love in the world by the way I live.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles Acts 10:34.37-43

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the country-side of Judea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand.

Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead - and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.' The word of the Lord Responsorial Psalm Response: This day was made by the Lord; we rejoice and are glad. Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, for his love has no end. Let the sons of Israel say: "His love has no end." R. The Lord's right hand has triumphed; his right hand raised me up. I shall not die, I shall live R. and recount his deeds.

The stone which the builders rejected has become the corner stone. This is the work of the Lord, a marvel in our eyes. *R*

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand.

Gospel Acclamation

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John. John 20:1-9 It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.' So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in.

Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself.

Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.
