My Peace I give you

The Gospel passage presented to us today forms part of Jesus' farewell discourse to his disciples in the Gospel of John and therefore it is, as always, very important to read carefully what Jesus says, who he is saying it to and who he is talking about! All of these are signposts to the importance of the sayings contained in today's passage. Therefore, we can initially establish that Jesus is talking to his disciples, to the people closest to him, but he is saying these things to them while still with them. This means that his time with them is coming to an end. Therefore, these words are really directed at a time when Jesus will not be among his followers, which makes these words even more important for us today.

Although Jesus is physically departing, one of his parting gifts to the disciples is peace. This peace however has nothing to do with the absence of warfare or trouble or strife. Indeed, it doesn't even have to do with a sentimental wellbeing. This peace is much more than that superficial notion of peace so prevalent in the world today, which can be easily shattered on a whim and can be disturbed by human frailty.

The peace Jesus speaks of is a gift that pertains to salvation. In the language of the Gospel of John the word 'peace' is a symbolic word, reflecting the great gift that God has given to humanity through Jesus. It is an Old Testament word closely associated with notions of the covenant, the in-breaking of God's Kingdom and the coming of the messiah, sent by God,

who was to announce peace and salvation. Therefore, as we can now see, those two words, peace and salvation, are intricately bound up with each other and cannot be separated. When Jesus says to the disciples he is giving them peace, he is also symbolically giving them salvation, a true peace, one that can never be shattered or taken away. In the prayer before communion when the priest says, "May the peace of the Lord be with you always" he is also symbolically saying the same thing. He is symbolically saying to the congregation 'may the salvation of God that brings us eternal peace be with you."



During these times, we are aware of many people carrying heavy burdens which weigh down, afflict and take away even the foreshadowing of peace which we experience here on earth. Today, our prayer for you is simple, but most profound. Our prayer for you today is simply, "Peace be with you".

A reading from The Acts of the Apostles Acts 15:1-2.22-29

Some men came down from Judaea and taught the brothers, 'Unless you have yourselves circumcised in the tradition of Moses you cannot be saved.' This led to disagreement, and after Paul and Barnabas had had a long argument with these men it was arranged that Paul and Barnabas and others of the church should go up to Jerusalem and discuss the problem with the apostles and elders.

Then the apostles and elders decided to choose delegates to send to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas; the whole church concurred with this. They chose Judas known as Barsabbas and Silas, both leading men in the brotherhood, and gave them this letter to take with them:

"The apostles and elders, your brothers, send greetings to the brothers of pagan birth in Antioch, Syria and Cilicia. We hear that some of our members have disturbed you with their demands and have unsettled your minds. They acted without any authority from us, and so we have decided unanimously to elect delegates and to send them to you with Barnabas and Paul, men we highly respect who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Accordingly we are sending you Judas and Silas, who will confirm by word of mouth what we have written in this letter. It has

been decided by the Holy Spirit and by ourselves not to saddle you with any burden beyond these essentials: you are to abstain from food sacrificed to idols, from blood, from the meat of strangled animals and from fornication. Avoid these, and you will do what is right. Farewell.

In the spirit, the angel took me to the top of an enormous high mountain and showed me Jerusalem, the holy city, coming down from God out of heaven. It had all the radiant glory of God and glittered like some precious jewel of crystal-clear diamond. The walls of it were of a great height, and had twelve gates; at each of the twelve gates there was an angel, and over the gates were written the names of the twelve tribes of Israel; on the east there were three gates, on the north three gates, on the south three gates, and on the west three gates. The city walls stood on twelve foundation stones, each one of which bore the name of one of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

I saw that there was no temple in the city since the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb were themselves the temple, and the city did not need the sun or the moon for light, since it was lit by the radiant glory of God and the Lamb was a lighted torch for it.
