# DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME

In todays Gospel story we meet Jesus at the end of His teaching day and his disciples are anxious to send the people home. But Jesus has who has one more lesson to give, this time in action. Jesus would not send the people away hungry so he sent the disciples off to check on the food supply. They come back with five barley loaves and two fish. Jesus took them blessed, broke and gave them to the apostles to feed the people. Imagine it; breaking five little buns into twelve pieces puts less than half a bun in each hand, even less fish. It was in the hands of the apostles that the bread kept on increasing.

The lesson that Jesus wants us to learn are first that he constantly nourishes us with the bread of Life and like Him to live in self giving to others. Jesus repeated that lesson more forcefully on Holy Thursday night, He took the bread, blessed, broke it and gave it to his disciples saying "This is my body which is given for you. Do this in memory of me". These words mean much more than changing bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Jesus. He is asking us to live our lives as he lived his giving himself in service to others. Every Sunday we gather as a community to celebrate Eucharist. We listen to God's word, we pray and are nourished in Holy Communion. Jesus wants us to continue living the Eucharist in our daily lives. In our giving to others, by respect, acts of kindness, generosity, goodness and love that we do in family and in community we continue to live the Eucharist and to make Christ present. That is what Jesus asks us to do when we are sent forth at the end of Mass.

### Sr. Pius McCarthy RIP





Sr. Pius McCarthy, St. Xavier's Convent, Ennis, died peacefully on the feast of St. Anthony, 13 June, in the care of the doctors and staff of University Hospital Galway, after a long illness borne with fortitude, courage and unwavering faith in her God.

Mary Teresa McCarthy, the second of five children, was born to Margaret Moran and Simon McCarthy on 16 July 1936, in Clohanes, Cree, Co. Clare. She is survived by her sister Bernadette Doyle and brothers Michael, Patrick and Senan. She attended Clohanes NS and the Mercy Sec. School, Kilrush, where she joined the Mercy community in 1954, making profession of perpetual vows in August 1960.

Having completed an Arts Degree and H. Dip. in Education at UCC, Pius taught in Kilrush, Kilkee and Ennis. Generations of students will remember her as a dedicated teacher of Geography and Gaeilge as well as Religion.

In retirement Pius undertook a whole new way of being in ministry in Ennis Parish, visiting the sick as well as helping at the Franciscan Friary, as reader, Eucharistic minister, flower arranger and sacristan, until illness forced her to give up in 2016. She then moved to St. Xavier's. Throughout her many trips to Galway for treatment, Pius retained an extraordinary optimism and never complained. She was looked after with great compassion and professionalism by the Care Staff at St. Xavier's; her unique presence will be sadly missed by family, community and her many friends.

We celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi today. At the Last Supper, the night before He died, Jesus gave His Body and Blood to His disciples and to us saying "take this and eat it, this is my body, take and drink, this is my blood". ((Matthew, 26:28). This was the first Mass. Since then it is our privilege to attend Mass and receive Holy Communion. The people of Ireland always had a great love and reverence for the Mass. During the Penal Laws (1695-1746) attendance at Mass was prohibited so the Eucharist was celebrated in isolated places using a boulder as the altar. These are now known as Mass Rocks. Jesus left us the Mass so that we keep his memory alive forever. Prayer after Holy Communion:

May the sweet name of Jesus be written in my heart,

Mary, mother of Jesus, may Jesus be in me and I in Jesus. May the bond of love be always between us

and never be broken. Dear Jesus, may it be thus forever. Amen.
