Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C) 14th July, 2019

"Our Sister, Mother Earth"

"LAUDATO SI', mi' Signore" (Praise be to you, my Lord). In the words of his beautiful canticle, Saint Francis of Assisi reminds us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us. "Praise be to you, my Lord, through our Sister, Mother Earth, who sustains and governs us, and who produces various fruit with coloured flowers and herbs".

These words are the opening lines of Pope Francis's powerful Encyclical Letter, Laudato Si': On the Care of our Common Home.

Pope Francis writes in the light of the grave crisis that now faces "our Sister, Mother Earth" and the whole of humanity, because of terrible destruction brought about by blind human greed.


He presents the Saint of Assisi as a model of how we might pull back from the brink.

Guided by the Holy Spirit, Saint Francis "lived in simplicity and in wonderful harmony with God, with others, with nature and with himself; he recognised an inseparable bond between concern for nature, justice for the poor, commitment to society, and interior peace."

He saw "nature as a magnificent book in which God speaks to us and grants us a glimpse of his infinite beauty and goodness. Just as happens when we fall in love with someone, whenever he would gaze at the sun, the moon or the smallest of animals, he burst into song, drawing all other creatures into his praise of our most loving Creator."

He can teach us that "rather than a problem to be solved, the world is a joyful mystery to be contemplated with gladness and praise."

Wreath Laying Service for the Clare War Dead: A service to commemorate over 600 young Clare men and women who lost their lives in the Great War 1914 to 1918 will take place on Sunday July 14th @ 2pm at the WW1 Memorial in the Clare Peace Park opposite Glór Theatre on the occasion of the 103rd Anniversary of the Battle of the Somme. The names of 147 men from Ennis are included amongst the 600 names inscribed on the monument.

Fr. Edward O'Callaghan OFM



Fr. Edward (known as Fr. Teddy) was born in Cork City on 10th March 1939. He entered the Franciscan Order in 1957 and was ordained a priest on 18th February 1967. He ministered in different Friaries around Ireland including Ennis where he was a member of the local Fraternity twenty years ago. He also served as Director of the Franciscan Pilgrimage to Lourdes and represented the Irish and English speaking pilgrims on the general Pastoral Council of the Sanctuaries of Lourdes. Fr Edward died peacefully on 3rd July 2019 in Marymount Hospice Cork. His Funeral Mass was celebrated in St. Francis Church in Cork on Saturday 6th July and after Mass he was laid to rest in the Franciscan Plot of St. Finbarr's Cemetery, Cork.
