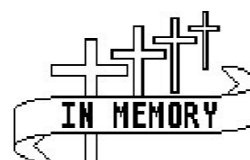
Cathedral Painting & Renovation Appeal

The names of 147 men from Ennis are included amongst the 600 names inscribed on the monument.

HISTORY IN THE MAKING: One hundred and thirty seven years ago a herdsman from the townland of Dromdoolaghty in Knockanean, Doora was murdered as he was on his way home from Sunday Mass at the Franciscan Friary in Ennis. Another local man Francie Hynes, known to the murdered man was charged with the murder and executed in September 1882. A great granddaughter of the murdered man Catherine Delahunty living in New Zealand and well on in years has written a book on the story. The book will be launched in the Grove Bar, Roslevan on Tuesday Night 9th of July at 9.00pm by Dr Ciaran O'Murchada. Lk. 10:1-12.17-20

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and
sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the
towns and places he himself was to visit. He
said to them, "The harvest is rich but the
labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the
harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start
off now, but remember, I am sending you out
like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no
haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the
road. Whatever house you go into, let your
first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a
man of peace lives there, your peace will go
and rest on him; if not, it will come back to
you. Stay in the same house, taking what
food and drink they have to offer, for the

labourer deserves his wages; do not move
from house to house. Whenever you go into
a town where they make you welcome, eat
what is set before you. Cure those in it who
are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is
very near to you". But whenever you enter a
town and they do not make you welcome,
go into its streets and say, "We wipe off the
very dust of your town that clings to our feet,
and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the
kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, that
on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom
as with that town.'

The seventy-two came back rejoicing.
'Lord', they said, 'even the devils submit to
us when we use your name'. He said to
them, 'I watched Satan fall like lightening
from heaven. Yes, I have given you power
to tread underfoot serpents and scorpions
and the whole strength of the enemy;
nothing shall ever hurt you. Yet do not
rejoice that the spirits submit to you; rejoice
rather that your names are written in
heaven'.
