A number of cafes offer a discount when you bring your own cup and also sell **'Keep Cups'!**


Some tea companies intend to stop using tea bags as there is plastic among the constituents of the bag and that is not good for our health or the environment!

Wreath Laying Service for the Clare War Dead: A service to commemorate over 600 young Clare men and women who lost their lives in the Great War 1914 to 1918 will take place on Sunday July 14th @ 2pm at the WW! Memorial in the Clare Peace Park opposite Glór Theatre on the occasion of the 103rd Anniversary of the Battle of the Somme. The names of 147 men form Ennis are included amongst the 600 names inscribed on the monument.

Another local man Francie Hynes, known to the murdered man was charged with the murder and executed in September 1882. A great granddaughter of the murdered man Catherine Delahunty living in New Zeland and well on in years has written a book on the story. The book will be launched in the Grove Bar, Roslevan on Tuesday Night 9th of July at 9.00pm by Dr Ciaran O'Murchada.
