First Sunday of Advent

(Year C) 1st December, 2019

History, Mystery, Majesty

We all know what a Family Tree is! It is from, and within our family, that we first came to know who we are, and to know what love is. In a family we find a home where we feel safe and protected.

But we belong to another family as well—God's family and, as brothers and sisters of Jesus; His family tree is also ours.

During these four weeks of Advent we, the family of Faith, trace Jesus' family, and ours, through the Jesse Tree in the Cathedral. On our Jesse Tree we place symbols of our ancestors in Faith and of some of the big events in their lives. The continuity of God's love, patience and grace across the centuries to the most unlikely people in the midst of their failures, and God's promise of a Saviour, is the story re-told in the Jesse Tree. This story climaxes in the Incarnation, but we, as Christians need to listen to the Old Testament Story for what it teaches us about God and ourselves.

During this Advent Season, as the different symbols are hung on our Jese Tree, let us allow the roots of Faith to take hold and grow in our lives.

When we celebrate the birth of Jesus, the new shoot from the stump of the Jesse, with hope-filled anticipation we await the completion of God's promise.

We also acknowledge Jesus' threefold coming....in History at Bethlehem, in Mystery through word and sacrament and His coming in Majesty at the end of time. As we look to our celebration of Christmas, we pray that we will remember that, in Jesus, God's Son, we have received the most wonderful gift of all.





Sr. Nancy O'Farrell, St. Xavier's Convent, Bothar na Trocaire, Ennis, Co. Clare, died peacefully on Tues 19th November 2019, in the compassionate care of the doctors and staff of Ennis Hospital, after a very short illness, borne with serenity and acceptance.

Nancy (Anne) O'Farrell, the second of eight children, was bom to Mary Josephine Davitt and Denis O'Farrell on 13 January 1929, in Carrownakelly, Killaloe, Co. Clare. She attended her local primary school and completed second level education at St. Senan's Secondary School, Killaloe, after which she joined the Mercy community at St. Xavier's, Ennis on 23 September 1947; she made profession of perpetual vows on 03 August 1953. She was known for many years as Sr. Mary Lua.

Having qualified in Carysfort College as a primary teacher, Nancy taught in Ennis for just three years before joining the pioneer group of seven sisters who left Ennis in 1959 to open Mary Immaculate Queen Grade School in Lemoore, California, where she spent 31 years in the ministry of education. When she returned to Ireland in 1990, Nancy was very happy to take up a teaching post in the Mercy Primary School, Oughterard, Co. Galway, from which she retired six years later and returned to her beloved home territory of Killaloe, until health concerns brought her back to St. Xavier's just two short years ago.

Go dtuga Féile tréimhse na hAidbhinte lúcháir, sonas agus síocháin dúinn féin, dár muintir agus don tír eile. Sin é ár nguí chugat trí Chríost ár dTiarna. Áiméan.

Today is the first Sunday in Advent and we can reflect on it as a time of waiting, watching, preparation, light and quiet reflection on the Person who is to come. A new Liturgical year has begun and we reflect on the fulfilment of God's Plan, the coming of His kingdom. It is a period of four weeks prior to Christmas. It is a season which helps us to prepare for the great feast of Christmas. The Advent Wreath is prepared and blessed on the first Sunday of Advent. This is a long standing custom in Europe. It is made from holly and evergreen leaves in the form of a circle with four candles representing each week. The circle reminds us of eternity which has no beginning or end. One candle is lit for each Sunday in Advent. During Advent we ought to follow the way of the Lord and repent of our sins so that we can welcome Jesus when He comes. We pray: Almighty God in your mercy, be with us always with the help of the Holy Spirit. May the season of Advent be a time of joy, happiness, peace for each of us, our people and the country. We make our prayer through Christ. Our Lord, Amen.
