Moveable Feast

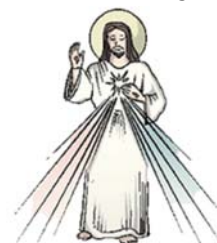
In A.D. 325, the Council of Nicaea was convened by Emperor Constantine. Until then Easter had been celebrated on different days of the week. That Council, however, decreed that Easter be celebrated on a Sunday -- between the dates of March 22nd and April 25th. The pagan festival of Eastre occurred at the same time of year as the Christian observance of the Resurrection of Christ. As Christian converts were slowly won over, it made sense to alter the festival and make it a Christian celebration. The early name, Eastre, was eventually changed to its modern spelling, Easter.

Domhnach Cásca.

Inniu Domhnach Cásca, an fhéile is mó i bhféilire na hEaglaise. Mar sin bímis lúcháireach inniu. Tá daichead lá an Charghais thart fad a bhíomar ag guí, ag déanamh iobairtí agus cleachtaí spioradálta chun a bheith réidh an Cháisca a cheiliúradh le díograis croí agus brí iomlán a bhaint as bás agus aiséirí Chríost. Tá Críost faoi ghloir anois. Nuair a d'aiséirigh sé léirigh sé gur bhuaigh sé ar an mbás, ar an bpeaca agus ar chumhacht an oilc. Chruthaigh sé gurbh É féin Dia. Bhí an tuama folamh agus bhí ionadh an domhain ar a chairde nuair a thaispeáin Íosa é féin dóibh. D'aithin siad é. Chreid siad go raibh sé aiséirithe, agus líonadh a croí le háthas.

The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is the greatest feast in the Liturgical Calendar. Let us rejoice. We have spent the forty days of Lent praying, making sacrifices and engaging in spiritual exercises in preparation for the celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus. Christ is in glory now. In the Resurrection Jesus showed his victory over death, sin and the power of evil. He proved he was God. The tomb was empty .and his friends were surprised when he appeared to them. They recognised him .They believed he had risen from the dead and they were filled with joy.

In Ireland there is much folklore surrounding the Resurrection of Jesus. Our ancestors believed that the sun danced, and that nature celebrated on Easter Sunday because Jesus had risen from the dead. They used to go to the hilltops to see this spectacle.

This Easter Sunday we must stay at home and take part in the Mass on Local or National Radio, on Webcam or on Facebook. We continue to pray that we may be safe from the Coronavirus and that it may soon be overcome. We can say this circular prayer each morning.

power, and because God was with him, Jesus
went about doing good and curing all who had

that they killed him by hanging him on a tree,
yet three days afterwards God raised him to
life and allowed him to be seen, not by the
whole people but only by certain witnesses

people and to tell them that God has

appointed him to judge everyone, alive or
