Sunday of Divine Mercy

(Year A) 19th April, 2020

H.E.L.P. Hebrews 4:16

So let us keep on coming boldly to the throne of grace, so that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need.

So, when you need help, step into – or stumble into the throne room of grace and use these four Scriptures as the substance of your prayer.

H - "Hear me lord and answer me for I am poor and needy." Psalm 86:1

Beginning with a plea for help is the way to let God know you need Him. And, as you do, you can just lay it all out... I am poor and needy! I am worn out. I am scared. I am totally confused.

Whatever your need is, tell God. Acknowledge that your soul is needy for God's strength and your spirit is poor, humbled, and contrite before Him. He hears you and He will help.

E - "Establish my steps in your word." Psalm 119:133

When you ask Him to direct you – to be the captain of the ship as you cross stormy seas! You are asking Him to show you how to stand firm when the wind blows strong and how to run the course He has laid out for you. Tell God you need His direction and ask Him to steady you and keep you walking within the safety of His Word.

L - "Let your compassion quickly meet our needs because we are on the brink of despair."

Psalm 79:8 The Psalmist was asking - pleading with God not to hold their past against them but instead, lavish them with His compassion because they were on the edge of despair. Ever felt like that? If you are on the "brink of despair" because of circumstances that may have roots in your past, ask God to let His compassion lift you from that low place. God's compassion will comfort and strengthen you

P - "Protect me God because I take refuge in You. I say to the Lord, You are my Lord, apart from You I have nothing good." Psalm 16:1

Often when we run to God for help, it's because our circumstances or heartache have made us feel vulnerable. And when we feel that way, we just want a refuge - God promises His protection to those who take refuge in Him. Pray along with the Psalmist and adopt His humble spirit. Tell God that outside of Him, you have nothing good to offer or lean on. You don't need to take refuge in your own abilities or strength, you take refuge in Him and He will protect and help you when you need it most.



If you need some grace today, come to His throne. If you need mercy or help, walk through the "door," Jesus Himself the Risen Lord will hear and answer you.

Inniu ceiliúrtar Domhnach Thrócaire Dé. Is é Naomh Eoin Pól II a bhunaigh an fhéile seo i mí na Bealtaine 2000. Spreagadh deabhóid Trócaire Dé trí scríbhinní Siúr Faustina, bean rialta ón bPolainn a fuair bás sa bhliain 1938 agus í in aois tríocha trí bhliain. Ní haon rud nua an teachtaireacht maidir le Trócaire Dé. Ach meabhraíonn sé dúinn gur mhúin an Eaglais i gcónaí sa Scrioptúr agus sa traidisiún go bhfuil Dia trócaireach agus go bhfuil maithiúnas ar fáil do gach peaca. Tá a thrócaire i bhfad níos mó ná aon pheaca. Níl le déanamh againn ach teacht os comhair Dé go humhail agus muinín a bheith againn as a thrócaire. Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. It was instituted by St John Paul II in May 2000. The message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina a Polish nun who died in 1938 aged thirty three years. The message of God's Divine Mercy is nothing new. The Church has always taught through Scripture and through tradition that God is merciful, and that forgiveness is available for all sins. His mercy is much greater than any sin. We ought to come before God humbly and with confidence in his Divine Mercy. We can say this prayer today; *O fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us*.

This Easter is different as Ireland and the whole world is threatened by Coronavirus. Our social interaction is limited, and we must stay at home and away from people. Let us not be downhearted. In his Urbi et Orbi Easter message Pope Francis has reminded us that we are not alone but united with Christ in prayer.

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.

'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit.

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him:

'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.

PROFESSION OF FAITH
