ENSURING THE CHURCH IS A SAFE PLACE FOR CHILDREN

Just over a year ago Pope Francis convened a meeting of Church leaders in Rome to discuss safeguarding children and vulnerable adults in the Church. What has happened in Ireland in the intervening period?

Child safeguarding is not just about guidance or procedures; it is also about putting into place, through our actions and our hearts, best practice based on Gospel values, national

legislation, canon law and international norms. The National Board for Safeguarding Children in the Catholic Church in Ireland is placing increasing emphasis in translating written policies and procedures into concrete action and pastoral based ministry.

Reviews by the National Board, such as the one in this diocese last January, are focused on listening to children, complainants and respondents, as well as those who minister in child safeguarding – a shift away from merely examining written procedures.

A lot of work has gone into getting our written policy and procedures sound and fit for purpose; we will always review and update these as required following changes to civil or canonical requirements.

Pope Francis asks us to give concrete witness of faith in Christ: 'You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden' (Mt 5:14). Our Lord Jesus Christ calls every believer to be a shining example of virtue, integrity and holiness. All of us, in fact, are called to give



concrete witness of faith in Christ in our lives and, in particular, in our relationship with others.'

We believe that the Church in Ireland has matured, in terms of child safeguarding practice, from slavishly following procedures (still important and must be adhered to) to really understanding the importance of acting compassionately with a true heart to safeguard children.

Although the month of May is normally seen as the safeguarding month in the Diocese, given the current situation with Covid-19, Bishop Fintan and the safeguarding committee believed it was best to cancel safeguarding month. However, work this years has continued in making sure that the current way of working via social media, webcams etc is safe for all through quidance on best practice Online communication, Data Protection and the use of social media to broadcast Mass & Ceremonies.

One great news story in the midst of all the current challenges is the exemplary way that safeguarding is being implemented across this diocese from the ground level in the individual parishes to the diocesan committees. This excellent work and care by so many committed people is reflected in the recently published final report on the review in Killaloe diocese. Re-Opening of our Churches

Our Churches will reopen for private prayer from Monday 18th May. This will give people who wish the opportunity to call to the Church, say a prayer, light a candle, sit for a time in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Churches are obliged to close when Mass or Funerals are being celebrated until at least the 20th July.

From Monday the Cathedral and St. Joseph's Church will be open for visits. We ask people to respect social distancing and to sit only in the designated seats. The Cathedral will open from 9am-10.45am & 12noon –7pm each weekday

St Josephs will open from 2-4pm each weekday
