The Ascension of the Lord

Today we celebrate the Feast of The Ascension, when Christ Jesus in the presence of his followers ascended to Heaven. The question is "Where is Heaven"? In the past we had a rather simplistic idea that earth was here and heaven was up there, somewhere

above the clouds. We imagined it almost as a physical place and people often asked how could so many people fit there? As we all know the universe is huge and a mystery and all our physical travelling won't find us heaven. Christ our God came among us in human form to show us the way to live and the way to heaven. He told his disciples to go and to bring His message to the ends of the earth. On our own we are helpless and all we can do is to live from day to day and try to survive and stay healthy.

We live in a complex world sometimes great, sometimes rotten, but unable to make a huge difference in creating a society. Christ knows helplessness and our frailty and he comes to our help. He came to us as one of ourselves; he came to us in human form. As a man and as one of us, he showed us the way.

Not using his power as God but in a simple

and ordinary way as man. Having completed his life here on earth he ascended to the father and he assured us that he was not leaving us alone, that there were many rooms in his father's house and that he was going to prepare a place for us. He said do not let your

> hearts be troubles. Christ's ascension was not just to make his appearance before God his father.

> The Word, never before clothed in human nature has ascended as a man and shows himself in strange and unfamiliar fashion. He has done this on our account and in our name. so we can have life. As a member of race our transmitted to us the glory of being children of God.

> So the Feast of the Ascension is a feast of great hope. We tend a garden in the hope of a

harvest at a later date, so we too hope that Christ will be true to His word always telling us to grow and to blossom, ever present to us in the community, in the scriptures, in the breaking of the bread and in nature. Where two or three of us are gathered in His name, He is ever present to welcome us to His home.

Matt Talbot Novena

Matt Talbot the Dubliner on the road to canonisation conquered his addiction to alcohol by embracing a life of prayer and penance and turned his life around for the better. He died suddenly on the way to Sunday Mass on June 7th 1925, Trinity Sunday.

This year Trinity Sunday also falls on the 7th June. The problem of addiction especially to drugs and alcohol is one of greatest challenges for our country and destroys the lives of individuals and families.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. "It is". he had said, "what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit."

Now having met together, they asked him, "Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" He replied, "It is not for you to know times or dates that

the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth."

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there."
