Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A) 12th July, 2020


There's a sower and a reaper in all of us , more often than not we take little notice of the precious moments when we lay the seed in the awaiting soil of another's life.

Our Mass today reminds us about God's creative Word.


In the first reading, it is compared to the rain which waters the earth and brings growth.

Feast of St. Swithin 15th July

St. Swithin is an Anglo-Saxon bishop of Winchester who lived in the 9th century. He was famous for his charitable works. According to tradition, on his death bed, he requested to be buried outside where passers-by could walk over his grave and raindrops fall upon it. Nine years later the shrine was built inside Winchester Cathedral for his remains. On 15th July 971 during the ceremony it started to rain and continued for another forty days. It also said if St. Swithin's feast is fine it will continue for forty days.

Return to Public Masses

We warmly welcome everybody back. We are concerned for the safety of everybody and it is important to remember that the obligation to attend Mass in person was lifted at the start of the pandemic and will continue for some time to come. If you do not feel safe or confident coming to Mass in person, you are most welcome to continue to join us for Mass on line or via parish radio.

Seating capacity in all our Churches will be reduced. Numbers will vary in each church according to capacity.

8am Sunday Mass

The 8am Sunday Morning Mass from Sunday next 19th July will be celebrated in the Cathedral. The transfer from Cloughleigh Oratory to the Cathedral is to facilitate the attendance of a large number of people at an early morning Mass. In the parish currently the 7.45am Mass in the Poor Clare's Monastery is suspended and the decision to move will be reviewed at the end of September. This Mass like all Masses in the Cathedral will be available on our parish webcam and parish radio 106.4fm

Guidance for returning to Mass

- 1) Hand sanitisers are available at each Church. We ask you to avail of these as you enter and leave the Church.
- 2) We ask you to adhere to social distancing and follow signage.
- 3) Seats available for use will have signage.
Please only sit on these seats.
Families are welcome to sit together.
Two people per seat from different household. (seated on either side of the seat).
- 4) Holy Communion will be brought to you.
Please stand if you wish to receive.
The Priest/Eucharistic Minister will wear a face shield and sanitise their hands before and after distributing Holy Communion.
- 5) Entry to the Cathedral will only be through the main door.
- 6) Exit using all doors.
- 7) When capacity of the Church is filled, a sign at the entry will state "Full capacity".
- 8) The collection at weekends will take place as you enter the Church.
- 9) Holy water fonts are not currently in use.
- 10) The sign of peace is suspended.

These measures are to keep everybody safe and will constantly be reviewed.

We really look forward to welcoming you back to Mass.
