A New Beginning

Friday 13th March was the last day when Mass was celebrated in public in our parish. During the last 16 weeks Mass has continued to be celebrated. Many reading this newsletter will have seen live stream

Masses and listened on our parish radio link (106.4fm).

The only people allowed within our churches over this time of lockdown have been the priests of the parish, sacristans, readers, cantors and musicians.

Monday 18th May proved to be a happy day, as the doors of our churches reopened for private prayer. However our churches had to close when Mass was being celebrated.

Funerals were restricted in numbers, firstly ten people and recently this number increased to 25. This has been

very difficult for all concerned; family, undertakers and clergy.

At this time it is appropriate to thank those who have enabled the life of the parish to continue over the weeks. Firstly we thank you for supporting us through your prayers. The voice of prayer has not been silenced and wherever you have been I am certain that our prayers have been with you. Secondly, those involved in reading

God's Word and singing His praises have added greatly to the online experience of prayer.

Thirdly, many have sent generous donations and committed to increase their regular financial support.

This has been very important because our income has decreased for obvious reasons over the past 16 weeks. We know that this support will remain necessary over the coming weeks and months.

Above all we thank God for bringing us through to this opportunity on Monday next 29th June, the feast of SS Peter & Paul to once again celebrate Mass and the Sacraments in public. Our faith may have been tested but HE who is mighty has remained constant and true.

Things may not simply return to how they were before, at least not for some

considerable time. We continue to pray for those affected by the virus, the sick, bereaved, departed and also for those whose employment and financial security are under serious threat at this time.

Let us also remember and pray for those in authority, whose great responsibility it is to make decisions which affect the lives of so many others. May they seek and receive the precious gift of wisdom.

Peter and Paul

On Monday we honour two men different in character but united by their burning love for Jesus Christ.



Peter — a fisherman, impetuous, headstrong, the first to be called by Christ, yet denies that he even knows Him when challenged by a servant girl. He overcomes this failure to become the leader of the early Church.

So Peter is no cardboard figure who can do no wrong; he is a man aware of his own sinfulness but aware also of the owner of God at work in Jesus.



Paul— an intellectual, yet a man of burning passion and commitment. At first this energy was channelled into supressing Christ's followers. After his conversion Paul used it to spread the Christian message through the Roman world. He wanted everyone to share in Christ's victory over sin and death.

Their faith brought both men to Rome: there they were put to death during Nero' persecution of the Christians.

We give thanks for their faith in Jesus Christ: it is our inheritance.

Peter & Paul are patrons of our Cathedral and on Monday eventing Bishop Fintan will celebrate the 7.30pm Mass in the Cathedral to seek their intercessions and protection as we begin again.

Return to Public Masses

We warmly welcome everybody back. We are concerned for the safety of everybody and it is important to remember that the obligation to attend Mass in person was lifted at the start of the pandemic and will continue for some time to come. If you do not feel safe or confident coming to Mass in person, you are most welcome to continue to join us for Mass on line or via parish radio.

Seating capacity in all our churches will be reduced. Numbers will vary in each church according to capacity.

Eucharistic Ministers

We are most appreciative of those who exercise their ministry as Eucharistic Ministers. Due to limited numbers allowed to attend Mass, as a temporary measure, we are reducing the number of Eucharistic Ministers that will be required for Ministry. The parish will contact directly Ministers of the Eucharist as required.

Guidance for returning to Mass

- 1) Hand sanitisers are available at each Church. We ask you to avail of these as you enter and leave the Church.
- 2) We ask you to adhere to social distancing and follow signage.
- 3) Seats available for use will have signage.
 - Please only sit on these seats.
 - Families are welcome to sit together.
 - Two people per seat from different household. (seated on either side of the seat).
- 4) Holy Communion will be brought to you.
 - Please stand if you wish to receive.
 - The Priest/Eucharistic Minister will wear a face shield and sanitise their hands before and after distributing Holy Communion.
- 5) Entry to the Cathedral will only be through the main door.
- 6) Exit using all doors.
- 7) When capacity of the Church is filled, a sign at the entry will state "Full capacity".
- 8) The collection at weekends will take place as you enter the Church.
- 9) Holy water fonts are not currently in use.
- 10) The sign of peace is suspended.

These measures are to keep everybody safe and will constantly be reviewed. We really look forward to welcoming you back to Mass.
