Feast of Our Lady of Mercy Thursday 24th September

A cross in the grounds of the Cathedral commemorates a parish mission that took place here in Ennis in November 1853.

During the Mission conducted by the Jesuits a meeting of parishioners was held in the Cathedral and a unanimous decision was taken to invite the Sisters of Mercy to establish a convent in the town to provide education for the girls of Ennis and the surrounding area. A fundraising committee was set up to raise the necessary money to purchase a property for the convent.



Dean Kenny the parish priest of Drumcliffe made contact with St. Mary's Convent of Mercy in Limerick pleading for sisters to come to Ennis. The following year 1854 the first arrived to establish the first Convent of Mercy in Row House in Arthurs Row. In 1855 St. Xavier's school, known as the Convent school opened its doors to 547 girls.

For the past 166 years there has been a Mercy presence in this parish. The Sisters were pioneers in education, healthcare, social services and spirituality in our parish.

An example of the vision the sisters had for education in Ennis can be seen in the Holy Family Schools built in 1965 by Mother Lelia McKenna. These schools have stood the test of time, bright and airy classrooms facing south, each classroom self contained with toilets and cloakrooms, ideal for Covid Times.

Catherine McAuley who in 1831 founded the Sisters of Mercy was a woman of great vision, an innovator, a woman of prayer and deep faith. She reminded her sisters that each day is a step we take towards eternity. The final step will bring us into the presence of God.

On Thursday next, we celebrate Mercy Day, a day of prayer in thanksgiving for the Mercy Tradition that has blessed so many over the past 166 years.

To the sisters in St. Xavier's Convent and in the many other communities in the parish we thank you for dedicating your lives to bring the good news to the poor and to heal the broken hearted.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner going out at daybreak to hire workers for his vineyard. He made an agreement with the workers for one denarius a day, and sent them to his vineyard. Going out at about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the market place and said to them, "You go to my vineyard too and I will give you a fair wage." So they went. At about the sixth hour and again at about the ninth hour, he went out and did the same. Then at about the eleventh hour he went out and found more men standing round, and he said to them, "Why have you been standing here idle all day?" "Because no one has hired us" they answered. He said to them, "You go into my vineyard too." In the evening, the owner of the vineyard said to his bailiff, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with the last arrivals and ending with

the first." So those who were hired at about the eleventh hour came forward and received one denarius each. When the first came, they expected to get more, but they too received one denarius each. They took it, but grumbled at the landowner. "The men who came last" they said "have done only one hour, and you have treated them the same as us though we have done a heavy day's work in all the heat." He answered one of them and said, "My friend, I am not being unjust to you; did we not agree on one denarius? Take your earnings and go. I choose to pay the last-comer as much as I pay you. Have I no right to do what I like with my own? Why be envious because I am generous?" Thus the last will be first. and the first last."
