Parish House Renovation

Work the 0 N refurbishment and restoration of the parish house on the grounds Of the Cathedral will begin in the coming week.

Built in 1878, this (a listed house, building), has been home to 64 priests in its 142 year history.

In its long history the house has only been subject to major renovation on one occasion 60 years ago. The current reconstruction is in many ways long overdue and will include; removal of asbestos, re-roofing, insulation and energy conservation, resolving accessibility issues, upgrading of the Adoration Chapel and the provision of modern, accessible toilet facilities for use by parishioners attending the Cathedral.

The company awarded the contract for the work, following the tendering process, are Jada



Construction. The work is expected to last 44 weeks and is scheduled for completion in July 2021. During this time there will be restrictions on parking in the cathedral grounds and we apologise for any inconvenience.

The priests who currently reside in the parish house, Frs. Tom, Joy and Dariusz, will relocate while the renovations are taking place but can be contacted at any time through the Parish Office or on their own mobile numbers.

Having foreseen the need for this work, the parish finance committee have been saving and budgeting for it in recent years. We are now in a position to carry out this essential work and we thank all of you, whose support has made it possible.

Friday, 20th November Our Diocesan Day of Remembrance for all who have died



Because 2020 has been a year like no other, the Diocese of Killaloe, in collaboration with the Anglican Diocese of Limerick, Killaloe & has decided to hold a Day of Ardfert, Remembrance on November 20th for those who have died in 2020. This Day aims to acknowledge those who have died this year and those who have been bereaved through the death of loved ones. It includes the remembrance of those who have died as a result of the global pandemic, as well as those who have died from other causes during the year. The day will help us to remember our own beloved dead but also acknowledge and pray for those whose passing and mourning have been so cruelly affected by the COVID protocols in hospitals and nursing homes and around funerals.

The focus of the Remembrance Day will be on short moments of prayer in which everyone can participate at home. These include the following:

A short radio message and blessing from Bishop Fintan and Bishop Kenneth Kearon (Church of Ireland) will mark the beginning of the day's prayer. (This will also be available on diocesan and parish websites, on Facebook and other social media platforms).

A Diocesan-wide moment of silence and individual prayer at 12 noon to remember the dead and bereaved. The angelus bell will be a reminder of this moment.

A short prayer time to be broadcast on Clare FM and Tipp FM on Friday Evening around 7 p.m. People are invited to light candles and place them in the window in the evening as an act of remembrance.
