Third Sunday of Advent (Year B) Gaudete Sunday 13th December 2020

The Joy of Christmas

Today, the third Sunday of Advent is also known as Gaudete Sunday. We light the rose coloured or pink candle on our Advent wreath. We are edging closer to the joy of Christmas when Jesus, the Word made flesh, was born of the Virgin Mary in Bethlehem. The entrance antiphon sets the theme:

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice! The Lord is near". Paul urges the Thessalonians in our second reading: "Be happy at all times; pray constantly; and for all things give thanks to God". Our search for joy and happiness is relentless - the common goal we all share, mystic and addict, hermit and Bon viveur, Saint and sinner.

Joy has been a constant theme in the encyclicals and

apostolic exhortations of Pope Francis so far, for example, Evangelii Gaudium:

The Joy of the Gospel 'fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus'. Amoris Laetitia:

The Joy of Love experienced by families is also the joy of the Church. Gaudete et Exultate: Rejoice and be Glad calls us all to holiness, 'for the Lord has chosen each one of us to be holy and blameless before him in love (Eph 1:4). "Far from being timid,"

morose or melancholy, or putting on a dreary face, the saints are joyful and full of good humour" #122. As C.S Lewis puts it, "Joy is the serious business of heaven". Let us radiate joy in anticipation of the Lord's coming.

We're now past the halfway point in our preparation

for Christmas. Joy, prayer and thanksgiving characterise our Advent liturgy. Like John the Baptist in today's gospel, we are called to make our lives a pointer to Jesus, our Risen Lord, living incognito in our world... "there stands among you - unknown to you - the one who is coming after me". In his farewell discourse with his disciples at the Last Supper, Jesus, the true source of all joy, tells them, "It is to the glory of my

Father that you should bear much fruit and be my disciples....I have told you this so that my own joy may be in you and your joy be complete". (John 15: 8,11).

Today then let's celebrate our joy in Christ's redeeming work among us, realising that he who is to come is indeed already among us "unknown to us".

Masses for Christmas: Following discussion and consultation in Ennis Parish and the Abbey Pastoral Area, the decision has been made to offer thirty-three Masses at different times in Churches in Ennis and Doora Barefield parishes in response to the wishes of people to attend Mass at Christmas. Beginning at 4pm on Christmas Eve and going through to midnight, from 7am on Christmas Morning up until the last Mass at 6.30pm on Christmas Night, there will be thirty-three Masses offered in seven different Churches in both parishes. People are welcome to the Mass and are reminded that capacity in all Churches is capped in line with Government guidance on attendance at public worship. There will not be a ticketing system in place but when each Church has reached its capacity people will be advised to choose the next available Mass time. All who come to Mass are asked to observe social distancing, to hand sanitise, wear a face mask and sit in the designated seats that are clearly marked in all Churches. People are asked to comply with stewards who will direct them to their seats. Please note that there will be no Children's Christmas Masses in any of the Churches this year. Today is the third Sunday of Advent and Christmas is near. Traditionally it is called Gaudete or Rejoicing Sunday and the first words of the Introit of the Mass are: "Rejoice in the Lord always: again I say rejoice! Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. (Phil 4: 4-5). The theme of Advent focuses on the coming of Jesus. In the Liturgy of the Word today, we are reminded that St. John the Baptist prepared the way of the Lord and joy is felt in his mission. Pope Francis in his 2014 Gaudete Sunday Homily said that we should not worry too much about what we have not done in preparation for Christmas but to think about all the good things life has given us. The priest wears rose-coloured vestments and the rose-coloured candle is lighting on the Advent Wreath. The change of colour is a reminder to increase our courage and to continue with our spiritual preparation especially through prayer and fasting. Lord, may you give us the strength and courage to develop and foster virtue now and always. Amen

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John. Jn 1:6-8.19-28

He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light.

This is how John appeared as a witness. When the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' he not only declared, but he declared quite openly, 'I am not the Christ.' 'Well then,' they asked, 'are you Elijah?' 'I am not,' he said. 'Are you the Prophet?' He answered, 'No.' So they said to him, 'Who are you? We must take back an answer to those who sent us. What have you to say about yourself?' So John said, 'I am, as Isaiah prophesied:

a voice that cries in the wilderness:

Make a straight way for the Lord.' Now these men had been sent by the Pharisees, and they put this further question to him, 'Why are you baptising if you are not the Christ, and not Elijah, and not the prophet?' John replied, 'I baptise with water; but there stands among you - unknown to you - the one who is coming after me; and I am not fit to undo his sandal-strap.' This happened at Bethany, on the far side of the Jordan, where John was baptising.
