A Reflection on the Trinity

Some thirty years ago I was Chaplin at a University in Australia. One day a young man who was working as a gardener there popped into my office and asked me to explain the Trinity to him.

Fortunately, I had enough sense to pause and to ask him first how he saw it. He went straight to the heart of the mystery by speaking of the mystery in terms of dance.

He thought of the Father as the Dance, the Son as the Dancer and the Spirit as the Dancing.

We come to know the Dance by watching the Dancer. We experience the Dance when we are drawn by the Dancer into the Dancing.

One could speak of God as Life, of Jesus as the one who lived this life and of the Spirit as the experience of living.

Perhaps best of all one can speak of God as Love, of Jesus as the Lover who incarnates this love, and of the Spirit as the experience of loving that we enjoy because of Jesus.

The three in one are dancing hand in hand, enjoying one another, enjoying their lives.

If this is true, it should be true of us too.

This feast reminds us that after death we will live in the presence of the Trinity for all eternity. In Confirmation we are given the mission to be faithful to our Faith and to proclaim Jesus to the world. The Sign of the Cross, the Glory be to the Father and Church Blessings are the usual devotions to the Blessed Trinity which are recited many times daily.
