Furthermore, you will notice from last week's bulletin that the Poor Clares are also beginning to re-open their convent slowly which is both understandable and very sensible.

In addition, Fr. Damian Casey, our recently ordained friar, has been transferred to Merchants' Quay, Dublin and will be taking up his post there at the end of this week. Damian was a familiar face in the cathedral where he performed duties his diaconate under the supportive and helpful eve of Fr. Tom Ryan PP. We thank Fr. The Feast of the Birth of John the Baptist will be celebrated on Wednesday 24 June. He is mentioned in the Scriptures as the precursor of Christ. He had the duty of preparing the way of the Lord. Everybody knew that his birth was a miracle, and many thought he was the Son of God. He went into the wilderness and soon the crowds surrounded him. He addressed them and encouraged them to change their ways, to repent and to be ready to accept Christ when he came on earth

When Jesus came, he asked to be baptised by John the Baptist. John was unwilling to do so but eventually did. Humility was his greatest characteristic. He referred to Christ and said "I am not worthy to untie the strap of His sandals." (Luke 3:16) and again he said "He must increase, I must decrease" (John 3:30).We ought to be humble in our daily lives like Saint John the Baptist and repent as is right. This prayer can be recited:

God's blessings on you St. John the Baptist, The Virgin Mary's blessings on you and my blessing on you

To you I came with my complaints Seeking friendship on account of God's love. Amen.

On the eve of the feast it was customary to light bonfires in prominent places such as hilltops or meeting places such as crossroads .It was called St. John's fire. This custom is discontinued in Ireland but still kept in some Celtic countries.
