## Nine Tips for Effective Time Management.

Record your daily routine mentally: This activity of time management will make you aware of how long you take to do whatever is on your list. If you have 10 things to do, are you able to cover up everything in the number of hours you have for the day? Analyse your free time. Identify the tasks that you are wasting your time on and make a conscious effort to cut them.

Prioritization: Manage your time, achieve your goals,

be successful. This is the pattern to follow. Managing time also means to spend time on priorities and not to waste time on nonpriorities. Know your priorities by asking yourself these questions. Identify urgent and important it. Which task is of high-priority? When a task is to be completed, which task can be done later. After

prioritization make a to-do list. Be realistic when

scheduling tasks.

Spend your morning in Most Important Tasks. Do you want to be productive with your time? If so, then identify the most important tasks from your todo list and get them completed first thing in the morning. According to this principle, you should get down to the most important tasks and focus on accomplishing first.

Leave the buffer-time between tasks: You feel you can make the most effective use of your time by jumping from one tasks to the next without anytime between. But the human brain needs a break after every 90 minutes in order to maintain the height levels of concentration and motivation.

Focus without distractions: Time management tips at works can be successful when you push yourself out of the distractive circle. So to stay on track with what you want to achieve, keep in mind your end goals. Focus on only one part of your work at a time. No responding to Texts or SMS, WhatsApp, no browsing on Web.

Stop being Perfectionist: A major reason why most people put off tasks on constantly delay the delivery of a project or product is that they are running after perfection. Since there are many tasks in your to-do list, perfection running after

concentrate more on getting.

Just say "NO". Don't agree to work on a task or help a colleague until you have some spare time. Keep your priorities straight and simple

Just Stop Multitasking: Managing two tasks at often results in loss of productivity. People who prefer to practice the habit of multitasking are finding it difficult to concentrate and maintain focus on work when needed.

Use a Diary or Online Calendar: Diary or Calendars have been used for time management for years. Now with an online calendar, you can schedule meetings, events, set reminders, and check your availability for a specific date from almost any device. These time management techniques are like the mantras for changing the way you live. With right mind set and right strategies you can live a more joyous life.

## **Friary News**



On Sunday, July 4th, we had our first "Healing Mass" in the friary at 3 pm. We were really delighted to see that so many turned out for it and that many others were able to join us on the webcam. As had been suggested, this took the traditional form of devotions where we started with a simple Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, followed by some Franciscan prayers that St. Francis of Assisi would have taught the early friars to say in abandoned churches and, after saying the Rosary for different intentions, the first part of the afternoon ended with a blessing of those present with the exposed host. In "normal" time, we would hope to have the anointing of people at this stage but due to Covid-19 restrictions, we were limited in what we could do. Still, we had music via the organ and singer which added greatly to the solemnity of the occasion. As I said, there was a good number of people present and people who normally could to not get to Sunday Mass, were able to avail of attending the Mass which followed.

So, although it was our first attempt at a "Healing Mass," we feel that it went off quite Once again, we were able to make a distinction between curing and healing. Curing is really getting back to where our body was before we got sick. Many of us can resonate with this, especially given the nature of the Covid-19 pandemic over the last year and a half. "Healing," of its nature, goes that little bit deeper into consciously asking God to help us deal with the negative events of the past which have had a traumatic and destructive influence on us all through life. So, we can see how we might be cured but not healed or healed but not cured where "healing" might occur over time rather than overnight. It would be fair to say that we are "healed" when we can look back on the original event and no longer feel the pain that was connected with it. In this sense, by owning the pain of the past, bringing it consciously to the surface and asking God to take care of it, we are then released to live life more freely. We hope to have this "Healing Mass" on the First Sunday of each month.

Once again, a warm thanks to all those who have supported us faithfully and generously in the past years and to say that you are remembered in our daily prayers.
