Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year B) 10th October, 2021

The word of God is something alive and active; it cuts like any double-edged sword. That opening line in the reading from the letter to the Hebrews prepares us for so much in our Christian living; yet while many may know it, few will be prepared for its consequences. These are laid out clearly in the Gospel story.

The rich man has kept all the commandments, followed God's word, but the double-edged sword comes into play when Jesus seems to raise the bar — sell everything you have and then come follow me.

The rich man's sadness is because he thought he had done enough. But there was more to do. So it is for all of us; when we think we have done enough as a Christian, there's always more being asked of us.


Peter too is astonished with what Jesus is saying for he and the apostles have given everything to follow Jesus, or at least that's what they believe. We will learn later in the gospel that Peter is not quite so perfect and committed as he believes.

This is part of our lesson for today. But we must not be downcast like the rich man. Listen to the word of God, listen to Jesus saying that you will not be left without reward for the commitment of following the Gospel.

Indeed it is more than we could ever imagine; we are called to a journey that is very different for each one of us and involves every aspect of our lives, not just prayer, not just religious practice,

not just good deeds. All of it together is our way to the kingdom and all of it together will help to build the kingdom on earth as it is in heaven. Let us pray for the wisdom that will help us to continue each and every day, trusting in God.

'We thank you, Holy God, for your holy name, which you have made to dwell in our hearts. And for the knowledge, faith and immortality which you have made known to us through your servant, Jesus. To you be glory for ever!' (Early Christian prayer)

Next Friday is the Feast of St Teresa of Ávila. She was born in 1515 and was raised in an atmosphere of good example and prayer. In 1535 she entered the Carmelite Order in Ávila. God had great work in store for her. He asked her to reform the Carmelite Order. Their rule at the time was not the rule of perpetual prayer for which it was established. In 1562 she founded the first monastery in Ávila which had as its patron Saint Joseph. Before she died she had established thirty monasteries. Her writings are an important part of the Church's literature.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark. Mk 10:17-30

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, 'Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You must not kill; You must not commit adultery; You must not steal; You must not bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour your father and mother.' And he said to him, 'Master, I have kept all these from my earliest days.' Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, 'There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth.

Jesus looked round and said to his disciples, 'How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!' The disciples were astounded by these words, but Jesus insisted, 'My children,' he said to them, 'how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is

easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.' They were more astonished than ever. 'In that case' they said to one another, 'who can be saved?' Jesus gazed at them. 'For men' he said, 'it is impossible, but not for God: because everything is possible for God'.

Peter took this up. 'What about us?' he asked him. 'We have left everything and followed you.' Jesus said, 'I tell you solemnly, there is no one who has left house, brothers, sisters, father, children or land for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not be repaid a hundred times over, houses, brothers, sisters, mothers, children and land - not without persecutions - now in this present time and, in the world to come, eternal life.'
