Today is **World Mission Sunday**. We think about and pray for those who are working on the missions. The words that Jesus speaks to Bartimeus "*courage, get up, he is calling you!*"

These are words which every missionary has heard

in their heart before they set out to go to the ends of the earth to proclaim the good news. We commend them for their courage, their selflessness and their faith in God.

As Christians we are called to minister to those in need. In Africa alone, with a population of 1.3 billion people across 54 countries, more than 74,000 religious sisters and over 46,000 priests and lay missionaries are operating 7,274 hospitals and clinics, staffing 2,346 homes for the elderly and vulnerable and educating over 19 million children in 45,088 primary schools. In many rural areas they are the only providers of healthcare and education. We are deeply proud of our history as a country that has sent countless thousands all over the world to help those in need.

To be on mission is to be willing to think as Christ does, to believe with him that those around us are also our brothers and sisters. Practically this means tending to their material needs and their spiritual needs.

Mission Sunday is an opportunity to practically help our brothers and sisters all over the world. To support the

generous work of missionaries in practical projects that make a difference in people's lives.

It is important to know how to receive as well as to give. Traditionally in Ireland we have viewed mission as something that happens someplace else. But increasingly we have come to rely on people from other countries to provide spiritual support to us. We are grateful for their generosity.



On World Mission Day, which we celebrate each year on the penultimate Sunday of October, we recall with gratitude all those men and women who by their testimony of life help us to renew our baptismal commitment to be generous and joyful apostles of the Gospel. Let us remember especially all those who resolutely set out, leaving home and family behind, to bring the Gospel to all those places and people thirsting for its saving message. Today is World Mission Sunday. Since 1926, the Church has traditionally remembered its universal mission. It is a special day set aside by Propagation of the Faith so that Catholics worldwide can rededicate themselves to the missionary work of the Church by prayer and action. Every parish in the world celebrates this day on the same date. Pope Francis released his annual Message for World Mission Sunday 2021 which is "We cannot remain silent, what we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20).

Each of us is a missionary by virtue of our Baptism. Jesus commanded His disciples, "Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation. He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who does not believe will be condemned". (Mark 16: 15- 16)

At present missionaries are desperately in need of support in many poorer parishes in Africa, Asia, and Latin America. We can assist them with our prayers and financial help. The money is used to build schools and churches and for the education of priests.

We pray for missionaries, for those who provide the support for their missions and for those who welcome them. *We ask God to bless missionaries throughout the world and to grant His graces to those who minister among us. Amen*
