This Sunday is also Gaudete Sunday when we are invited to rejoice as a Christian community anticipating with hope that this Christmas will be one of meaning and prudent responsibility that we share with one another.

Church Offertory Collection



Today is Gaudete Sunday or Joyful Sunday; the third Sunday in Advent when the rose colour of joy replaces the purple colour of repentance in the Advent Wreath and in the priest's vestments. We are more than halfway through Advent and we are invited to look forward joyfully to Christmas. The pink candle is lighted on the Advent Wreath. The change of colour reminds us to have courage and to continue our spiritual preparation especially by prayer and fasting. Saint John the Baptist prepared the way of the Lord. Let him be an inspiration for us. He reminds us today that a light has come into the world. Christ is that light. Take the following advice:

Follow the rule followed by every saint. Follow it tenderly, freely, gently. And God will shower his blessings on you in your life and in heaven too.

Lord, grant us strength and courage that we may always nurture in ourselves goodness and virtue. Amen
