Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is traditionally observed from the **18th to the 25th January**-the octave of St Peter and St Paul.

The story of the Maji visiting the Holy Family in Bethlehem have sometimes been seen as a symbol of the world's diversity-different religions and cultures- that comes to pay homage to the Christ-child. The story might therefore represent the unity of all created that God desires.

The prayer and theme 'We saw His Star in the East' for Christian Unity week 2022 has been prepared by the churches of the Middle East, the history of which was, and still is, characterised by conflict and strife, tainted with blood and darkened by injustice and oppression.

It was in the Middle East that the Word of God took root and bore fruit; and it was from this East that the apostles set our to preach the Gospel to the ends of the earth.

Yet now, the very existence of the small Christian community is threatened as many are driven to seek a secure life elsewhere. Like the light which is the child Jesus, the light of Middle Eastern Christianity is increasingly threatened in these difficult times.

Christians of the Middle East are conscious that the world shares many, of the travails and difficulties that it experiences, and yearns for a light to lead the way to the saviour-the light that overcomes darkness.

Serving the Gospel requires commitment to the human being, the poorest, the weakest and those marginalised. It requires from the churches transparency and accountability in dealing with the world, and with each other.

May we work together, to provide relief to the afflicted, to welcome the displaced, to relieve their burden, to build a just and honest society so that human beings can experience life, peace, justice and love.



The week of prayer for Christian Unity is kept throughout the world each year from 18 25 January. The theme for 2022 is: ", "We saw the star in the east and came to worship Him," Matthew 2:2. We are obliged to pray for unity among Christians so that the mission of Christ will be fulfilled. Let us pray as Jesus asked us on the night before He died, "May they all be one, Father, may they be one in us, as you are in me, and I am in you so the world may believe it was you who sent me" (John 17:21).

Two major splits occurred in the Church of Christ. In 1014 the Eastern Church in Constantinople separated from the Church in Rome and became the Orthodox Church. In the 16th century in Europe there was a schism and the Protestant Churches, Lutheran, Calvinistic and Anglican among others were established. For over a century the unity of the churches is sought. This is called Ecumenism.

The following is a prayer for Church Unity: *Father* of love you have called us to confraternity with your Son and to be witnesses to the gospel.

Through the grace of the Holy Spirit enable us to overcome divisions and remain steadfast that our joy may be complete.

We ask this through Jesus Christ Our Lord. Amen.

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. One may have the gift of preaching with wisdom given him by the Spirit; another may have the gift of preaching instruction given him by the same Spirit; and another the gift of faith given by the same Spirit; another again the gift of healing, through this one Spirit; one, the power of miracles; another, prophecy; another the gift of recognising spirits; another the gift of tongues and another the ability to interpret them. All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, who distributes different gifts to different people just as he chooses.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John Jn 2:1-11

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine'.

Jesus said, 'Woman, why turn to me? My hour has not come yet.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' There were six stone water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among the Jews: each could hold twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants. 'Fill the jars with water,' and they filled them to the brim. 'Draw some out now' he told them 'and take it to the steward.' They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine. Having no idea where it came from - only the servants who had drawn the water knew - the steward called the bridegroom and said, 'People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the quests have had plenty to drink; but you have kept the best wine till now.'

This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him.

PROFESSION OF FAITH
