Called to bring good news!

Jesus returns to his home town where he was brought up, the place that gave him the identity of Jesus of Nazareth. He

had left his native place to discover who he was and what God's plan was for him. The

people of Nazareth must have already heard his fame: his about preaching, his healing of the sick, and his casting of demons. Thev out must have been proud of him as а fellow Nazarene and must have been excited to hear him speak. The scene at the synagogue was kind of

dramatic. Jesus, reading a passage from the book of Isaiah that proclaimed good news to the poor, freedom from slavery, the recovery of sight, then told the people, "This is happening right here, right now before your very eyes."

His statement blew like a cold wind chilling their quiet contentment. He was taking the Scriptures out of the context of the past and acting as if they were referring to the present time! Next week's gospel tells us exactly how the people reacted on hearing his one line homily.

Jesus went on to form a community who would recognise the importance of being



called and being sent on a mission. For most of us, the call to follow Jesus has not been very dramatic. We could say that we were born into discipleship. For us process the of discipleship has to mean taking to

heart the words of Isaiah proclaimed by Jesus - words that Jesus applied to Himself. Bringing good news to the poor, proclaiming liberty to captives, bringing sight to the blind is part of our mission today. It is a mission for all times.

The challenge for each of us is how to put flesh on those words in the context of our own lives. What a challenge that is! And what a privilege it is too!



Scríobh sé a lán leabhar spioradálta a léitear go forleathan i gcónaí agus a bhfuil teagasc lán tairbheach iontu do chách. Bhíodh Naomh Proinsias ag síor mholadh na carthanachta agus na ceannasaíochta. Léirigh sé ann féin ceannasaíocht Chríost. Fuair Naomh Proinsias de Sales bás sa bhliain 1622.

Tomorrow 24 January is the Feast of St. Francis de Sales. He was born in Savoy in 1567. He abandoned property and fame and joined the Church. He was ordained bishop of Geneva and did a great job for the Faith among the followers of Calvin. He established the Order of Visitation for women. He has written many spiritual books which are always widely read and have many beneficial teachings for all. St. Francis constantly praised charity and leadership. He showed in himself the leadership of Christ. St. Francis de Sales died in 1622.

A reading from the book of Nehemiah Ne 8:2-6.8-10

Ezra the priest brought the Law before the assembly, consisting of men, women, and children old enough to understand. This was the first day of the seventh month. On the square before the Water Gate, in the presence of the men and women, and children old enough to understand, he read from the book from early morning till noon; all the people listened attentively to the Book of the Law.

Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden dais erected for the purpose. In full view of all the people since he stood higher than all the people - Ezra opened the book; and when he opened it all the people stood up. Then Ezra blessed the Lord, the great God, and all the people raised their hands and answered 'Amen! Amen!'; then they bowed down and, face to the ground, prostrated themselves before the Lord. And Ezra read from the Law of God, translating and giving the sense, so that the people understood what was read.

Then Nehemiah - His Excellency - and Ezra, priest and scribe (and the Levites who were instructing the people) said to all the people, 'This day is sacred to the Lord your God. Do not be mournful, do not weep.' For the people were all in tears as they listened to the words of wine, and send a portion to the man who has nothing prepared ready. For this day is sacred to our Lord. Do not be sad: the joy of the Lord is your stronghold.'
