Second Sunday of Lent (Year C) 13th March, 2022

Prayer Transforms Our Lives.

A story is told of a young revolutionary who prayed: "Lord, give me the grace to change the world". As he grew and approached middle age, realizing, that half of his life was gone without changing a single soul, he changed his prayer. He started praying: "Lord, give me the grace to change all those who come in contact with me; just my family and friends and I shall be satisfied". Then, having grown old, he began to see how foolish he had been. Now his one and only

prayer become: "Lord, give me grace to change myself". The season of Lent is a beautiful time of personal transformation through prayer.

JESUS` TRANSFIGURATION IS FOR THE TRANSFORMATION OF THE DISCIPLES

This Sunday gospel gives an account of the Transfiguration of Our Lord. The

Transfiguration is the story of prayer. The gospel tells us that as Jesus was praying his appearance changed. His divinity was revealed. He became radiant with the dazzling light of God's glory. When the disciples noticed that Jesus' appearance changed, they realized that here was someone divine.

Why did Jesus see the need to pray for their transformation?. Jesus prayed so that their eyes may be opened to unmask the false understanding of power and glory and begin to see in Jesus, the true messiah's identity. Therefore, the transfiguration of Jesus gives us the hope that when we are united with God and we allow ourselves to be immersed in His love in prayer we can experience transformation too.

JESUS` TRANSFIGURATION STRENGTHENED THE DISCIPLES` COMMITMENT

While Jesus was praying, there appeared Moses and Elijah. Moses represents the Law, and Elijah represents Prophecy. In the Transfiguration, Jesus was considered to be the fulfilment of Law and Prophets. Today, as Christians we are obliged to follow Jesus our master. To follow Him is not an easy task, it demands struggles, pain, sacrifice, persecutions

and even it costs our very lives. For that we need strength and grace which we receive in prayer. We can listen to Jesus in two ways first and foremost in prayer, secondly from the word of God. It is from the scripture we hear His voice. It is from the scripture Jesus speaks to us, instructs us and guides us. For that we need to spend little time in

reading his word. And by reading the Word of God our lives will be transformed.

As we are in the season of Lent, let us examine ourselves. In which areas of our life do we need to be transformed? Is it in the area of our broken relationships between spouses in marriage, between members in the family or between friends and closed ones? Is it in the area of our public moral life where we are being corrupt and dishonest? Is it in the area of our life of discipleship where we failed to bear witness to Christ and his values? This transformation cannot come about by mere human efforts. Prayer grants us grace for transformation, commitments to Jesus and obedience to His word.
