## Sr. Mary Howard, RIP



Sr. Mary Howard died peacefully on Wednesday 6 April 2022, in the compassionate and professional care of the staff of Roseville Nursing Home, Limerick.

Mary Frances was the second in a family of five, born to the late John Howard and Mary Madigan at Clarecastle, Co. Clare, on 12 May 1935; predeceased by her sister Ethel and brothers Philip and Paddy, she is survived by her brother John, Dublin, his wife Mary & sister-in-law Concepta, nieces and nephews.

Mary received her primary education at her local National School and second-level at Coláiste Muire, Ennis. On 02 February 1954 Mary entered the Convent of Mercy, Kilrush, taking Anthony as her religious name; she made profession of Perpetual Vows in 1959.

A graduate of Carysfort College, Dublin, Mary's life-long ministry was in primary education in the Mercy primary schools in Kilrush, Kilkee, Florida and Holy Family Senior School, Ennis, where she taught for twenty years, until her retirement in 2000.

In Ennis, Mary lived in the old St. Xavier's Convent and in Greendale, where she hoped to spend retirement, but readily agreed to return to Holy Cross Convent, Kilrush to assist in House ministry. However, back in Kilrush, Mary developed a whole new ministry through her devotion to the Parish, particularly the promotion of community singing and support of readers in church. She developed lasting friendships through her parish involvement.

Teaching was where Mary excelled; she was very competent and devoted to her pupils, and was highly regarded by former pupils for the kindness and concern they experienced in her

With that out jumped the cockerel and declared "Christ is safe". This is what the cockerel says each morning when he crows. Our hearts are overflowing with joy today also. Sing alleluia! **Praised be Jesus at all times, Alleluia!**
