THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER (Year C) 1st May, 2022

Christ the Lord is risen, Alleluia!

We can never sing or say that often enough, loudly enough or with sufficient faith and joy. At Mass today we hear the story of resurrection as told in the final chapter of St John's Gospel.

It is story of fishermen, a fish breakfast and of old friends reuniting. Jesus first met Peter and many of the other disciples when they were fishermen. They left all that behind to follow him. Now they had gone back to their boats and Jesus comes to them again. The circle is complete. This time it is not the flesh and blood Jesus with whom they had walked the roads of Palestine, climbed mountains, crossed lakes, sat with at table, heard preach and witnessed comfort the afflicted and defy the proud. This Easter morning they meet the

risen Lord whom they had seen arrested, crucified and put to death.

What makes today's Gospel reading so striking is the ordinariness of it all. The Lord doesn't appear to the disciples with a display of power and glory. He comes among them as a friend. He waits for them on the shore. They first see him as a dimly lit figure on the shoreline. They weren't sure at first. But once they hear his voice, they soon realise that it could only be Jesus. They had a poor night's fishing, but their disappointment vanishes when Jesus comes to them. The Lord prepares a fire on the lakeshore. Together, they cook and eat some of the


> fish that they had just caught. The disciples needed the company of their friend who had been taken from them just as they needed warm food after their long night on the lake.

The Lord comes into our hearts through the ordinary bits and pieces of our lives. Sometimes he might seem a distant, vague, dimly lit figure as we struggle to make sense of life. But there are also times when we feel the embrace of his presence and love. There are moments when we meet the Lord as a companion at table,

sitting beside us sharing in our joys, hopes, griefs and anxieties as friends do. Whether he seems near or far, the Lord is always present as our friend and savour.

At Mass this Easter day, we hear the Lord's voice as his word is proclaimed. As we gather around the table of the Lord to receive his body we become united to him.

Christ the Lord is risen, Alleluia!

Blessed Edmund Ignatius Rice

He was born in Callan, Co. Kilkenny on 1st June 1762. He was born into a large farming family of seven brothers and two



step sisters and had a happy childhood. It was at a time when Catholics were disadvantaged in Ireland and education was difficult and very limited for the poor.

Edmund did manage to receive an education and as a young man was apprenticed to an uncle, a business man in the port of Waterford. He was shocked at the poverty he saw in the city and he did what he could to help those who were suffering.

He married at the age of 25 but sadly his wife died in an accident. She gave birth on her deathbed to their daughter who had special needs. Edmund was heartbroken. He sold his business and devoted the rest of his life to the care of the poor through education. He was influenced in his work by the example of Nano Nagle who founded the Presentation Sisters in 1775.

Two men from his home town of Callan joined him in his work and a school was opened in Waterford in 1802.

Edmund founded both the Congregation of Christian Brothers and Presentation Brothers. In 1827 the first two Christian Brothers arrived in Ennis and for the past 195 years we have had the presence of the Brothers in our parish. Their contribution to education in this town is immense and still continues today through the great work of Ennis CBS and Rice College. On Thursday next 5th May, we celebrate the Feast of Blessed Edmund Rice. We give thanks for the presence of the Brothers with us who through their prayer, care for the poor and promotion of education, give witness to the Gospel. We pray for Brothers Denis, Dick, Seán, Michael & Donal who form the current community at their monastery on New Road.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John. Jn 21:1-19

Jesus showed himself again to the disciples. It was by the Sea of Tiberias, and it happened like this: Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee and two more of his disciples were together. Simon Peter said, 'I'm going fishing.' They replied, 'We'll come with you.' They went out and got into the boat but caught nothing that night.

It was light by now and there stood Jesus on the shore, though the disciples did not realise that it was Jesus. Jesus called out, 'Have you caught anything, friends?' And when they answered, 'No', he said, 'Throw the net out to starboard and you'll find something.' So they dropped the net, and there were so many fish that they could not haul it in. The disciple Jesus loved said to Peter, 'It is the Lord.'

At these words 'It is the Lord', Simon Peter, who had practically nothing on, wrapped his cloak round him and jumped into the water. The other disciples came on in the boat, towing the net and the fish; they were only about a hundred yards from land.

As soon as they came ashore they saw that there was some bread there, and a charcoal fire with fish cooking on it. Jesus said, 'Bring some of the fish you have just caught.' Simon Peter went aboard and dragged the net to the shore, full of big fish, one hundred and fifty-three of them; and in spite of there being so many the net was not broken.

Jesus said to them, 'Come and have breakfast.' None of the disciples was bold enough to ask, 'Who are you?'; they knew quite well it was the Lord. Jesus then stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and the same with the fish. This was the third time that Jesus showed himself to the disciples after rising from the dead.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.
