**Ordination of Antun Pasalic**

**On this Sunday in the Cathedral of SS Peter & Paul here in Ennis Bishop Fintan Monahan will ordain Antun Pasalic a Priest for service in the Diocese of Killaloe.**

Antun, a native of Zagreb in Croatia first came to Ireland when he was 18 years old with his brother Miko. They lived in Roscrea where Antun began working in the local Cistercian Abbey of Mount St.

Joseph's. In 2015 Antun was accepted as a candidate for the Priesthood for the Killaloe Diocese and began his discernment and studies in St. Patrick's College, Maynooth.

This pastoral year was lived here in the Parish of Ennis and in the Abbey Pastoral Area.

When the pandemic started in March 2020 and the seminary closed, Antun returned to Ennis to continue his formation and studies online. He returned to Maynooth when restrictions were lifted to complete his studies. On 8th September 2021 Antun was ordained a Deacon in the Cathedral and ministered in the Parish and

Pastoral Area, where he became a familiar face at Funerals, Baptisms and preached the Word of God on Sundays.

Please keep Antun in your prayers as he answers God's call to service as a Priest in the Diocese of Killaloe.

## A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jn 20:19-31

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.

As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.'  
After saying this he breathed on them and said:

'Receive the Holy Spirit.  
For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven;

for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him:

'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.

## PROFESSION OF FAITH

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation
