What News?

The day I heard, 'Our life like a bird has escaped from the snare of the fowler,' I thought of how we can all find ourselves at times, flapping about helplessly, held fast by one bad memory, one idea, a particular addiction, circling about ourselves and going nowhere.

The image of a bird escaping the snare evokes in us the joy of being alive, and the exhilaration of a big sky and a playful wind.

Psalm 124 '*we are free like a bird from the trap! the snare has been broken and we are free'*, implies that someone has broken the snare for us. Love has set us free!

The poet R. S. Thomas puts it well when he observes that -'we cover the ground faster but what news do we bring?'

Is it news of being free, of having second and third chances, of encouragement to spread our wings and rise above our fears? In a world where our desires are sometimes small as the product we are persuaded to buy, we can starve for a bit of good news.

There are ways of being great that may not be newsworthy; as when we reach out and undo the snare for each other.

This graceful gesture might be as simple as pointing out a patch of blue in a cloudy sky, or giving a hug instead of advice.

Either way, it seems to say, 'haven't you noticed, the snare is broken no, silly, you don't need wings. Come on. Let's fly' *Songs for the Slow Lane -Hugh O' Donnell*'

The challenge of today's Gospel!

Can we forgive as readily as Jesus forgives? Can we forgive and leave it?

If you want a real purpose-driven Lent, the prayer / fasting / almsgiving programme is made for you.


- Prayer-commit to a daily prayer.



A reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Philippians Phil 3:8-14

I believe nothing can happen that will outweigh the supreme advantage of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For him I accepted the loss of everything, have and I look on everything as so much rubbish if only I can have Christ and be given a place in him. I am no longer trying for perfection by my own efforts, the perfection that comes from the Law, but I want only the perfection that comes through faith in Christ, and is from God and based on faith. All I want is to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and to share his sufferings by reproducing the pattern of his death. That is the way I can hope to take my place in the resurrection of the dead. Not that I have become perfect yet: I have not yet won, but I am still running, trying to capture the prize for which Christ Jesus captured me.
