You Must Be My Witnesses

Fr. Pedro Arrupe, S.J., who was Superior General of the Society of Jesus for fifteen years, narrates how he personally met Jesus and decided to follow Him.

Pedro was a brilliant student of medicine, winning many prizes in anatomical studies and therapeutics at the University of Madrid. Everyone predicted he would become a great doctor. In October 1926, nineteen-year-old Pedro went to Lourdes as a volunteer. One day he accompanied the procession in front of the Grotto, walking beside a mother who was pushing a wheelchair in which sat her twenty-six-year-old son, a polio victim, his body crippled and completely deformed. The mother kept intoning aloud: "Holy Virgin, come to our aid." Then the Bishop came with the Blessed Sacrament and made the Sign of the Cross with it over the boy. At that instant, the boy leapt from his chair, completely cured.

Pedro says: "I returned to Madrid, but the books kept falling from my hands. My fellow students asked me: "What's happening to you?. You seem dazed!". Yes, I was dazed by the memory which upset me more each day; only the image of the Sacred Host raised in blessing and the paralyzed boy jumping up from his chair remained fixed in my heart."

Three months later, Pedro gave up his studies and entered the Novitiate of the Society of Jesus at Loyola and later became a priest.

This Sunday we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord. Jesus after fulfilling the mission entrusted to Him by His Father returned to Heaven. He has opened for us the portals of heaven. His ascension is the crowning of His mission. He has gone ahead of us to prepare a place for us. He invites us,

"Come, follow Me". As Jesus earthly life and ministry ends, our mission and ministry begin.

Today the responsibility of proclaiming the good news of the gospel and building the God's Kingdom now belongs to us. It is now up to each of us, to carry the mission and ministry of Jesus. Through us today, the world will know that Jesus is alive, present and active in our world.

Even though we are celebrating the Ascension of Jesus, he has not left or abandoned us.

He is with us when we gather to hear the Scriptures being proclaimed, He is with us when we celebrate his presence through the body and blood. He is with us when we reach out to help and support each other. He is with us when we live our daily lives as his disciples.

Lord, Jesus, we rejoice today in your Ascension to the Father's right hand. Thank you Lord, for offering us a share in your heavenly life. By your spirit, help us to lay hold of our inheritance in you the hope, the glory and the power that are the right of every child of God.

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Ascension. For forty days after His Resurrection Jesus appeared to the Apostles at different times. We see the power of God at work in the Resurrection and Ascension. Jesus was taken body and soul into Heaven. The apostles were frightened and downcast. Jesus asked them to continue His mission on earth. He told them to stay in Jerusalem and promised to send them the Holy Spirit as His work on earth was completed. Jesus is now in Heaven interceding for us and for the whole church.

Today is World Communications' Day. We live in the technological age. Every year it is celebrated by the Church on the Sunday before Pentecost Sunday. It emphasises how the media can promote Gospel values. The day was established by Pope Paul V1 in 1967. We are invited to reflect on the opportunities and challenges of the media. The media has an obligation to promote the truth at all times. This is a prayer for today: God of truth who enlightens us, guide the media. May they endeavour to support the dignity of the person through words and images. Give them discernment. May the Holy Spirit come to us and give us the courage to be witnesses to the Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them. he had told them not to leave Jerusalem. but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is', he had said 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy

throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'
