TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (Year C) 21st August, 2022

So often in life we can take things for granted. During lockdown so many of things we took for granted were taken away.

The freedom to go where we want, to meet with loved ones, to go to mass, all those everyday things which we presumed would always be available to us were gone.

We realised how we can take so many things for granted. Perhaps our own salvation is something that we presume upon.

In the gospel today Jesus is telling us to take nothing for granted. Strive to enter through the narrow way!

Sometimes we can presume because we have faith or because we have committed no great sins that we are guaranteed a place in paradise, Jesus challenges that assumption here. As Christians we can never stand still, we are either moving forward or falling backwards. We often devote time and energy to things which have no spiritual value, which have no bearing on our salvation.

Jesus words that the first will be last and the last first, again serve as a reminder that possessions, privilege and prestige in this world count for nothing in the world to come. What our earthly world views as important, benefits us very little in eternity. William Barclay tells a story of a woman who had been used to a life of luxury and respect. She died, and when she arrived in heaven, an angel was sent to conduct her to her house. They passed many a lovely mansion and the woman thought that each one, as they came to it, must be the one allotted to her. When they had passed through the main streets they came to the outskirts where the houses were much smaller; and on the very fringe they came to a house which was little more than a hut. "That is your house," said the conducting angel. "What," said the woman, "that! I cannot live in that." "I am sorry," said the angel, "but that is all we could build for you with the materials you sent up."

We should always be mindful of eternity and never take it for granted.

A walk through the Mass (week 3)

Penitential Rite, Gloria.

All the other ritual acts of this part of the mass are intended to gather us together into a worshipping assembly.

Sometimes we are asked to pause and recall our common need for salvation (the Penitential Rite).

Sometimes the hymn "Glory to God in the Highest" is sung or recited at this point.

The "Gloria" has been a part of the mass since about the sixth century! These longer hymns and responses are found in the newsletter.

Opening Prayer.

At the close of this first part of the mass the priest will ask us to join our minds in prayer, and after a few moments of silence he will collect our intentions into one prayers to which we all respond "Amen," a Hebrew word for "So be it."

After the readings we move to the table of the altar.

As at a meal in the home of a friend, we:

- 1. set the table
- 2. Say grace
- 3. Share the food (we eat and drink)
- At mass these ritual actions are called:
- 1. The preparation of the gifts
- 2. The Eucharistic Prayer
- 3. The Communion Rite
