First Sunday of Advent (Year A) 27th November, 2022

"ARE WE THERE YET?"

This is a question we have probably heard, many times throughout our lives. It is a question that often comes up on a journey by the kids in the car wondering when they would finally arrive at the seaside or some other destination. And it is a question that we may be tempted to ask during the Advent season.

This season of Advent, this beginning of the Church's new liturgical year, is an opportunity for us to take the time to enjoy the journey. To

proceed a little more slowly and intentionally towards Christmas – to notice what God is doing in our lives, and in the world around us, to help us be better prepared to welcome Jesus anew.

One liturgical year has just closed, and another lies open before us. The readings for this Sunday begin with the prophet Isaiah and the Psalmist both describing the

desire to journey toward the dwelling place of God. It speaks to a worldview that has God firmly at the centre – a time when the entire earth desires to "stream toward" this mountain of the Lord.

As Christians, we wait in joyful anticipation as we slowly move to this great celebration of Christ's birth. Once we're there, we take time to be enveloped by the mystery of God's own Son coming to us in the fullness of time. Then we set off anew into the rest of our year: travelling through Judea, walking after the Cross, and eventually celebrating Jesus' universal kingship again before the cycle repeats.



Christians recognise that this entire life is a pilgrimage to our heavenly home. We use the rhythm of the year to how show us anticipate, prepare, and walk this journey. Perhaps we can take this Advent to truly place ourselves in the mindset of the traveller. Let us walk the wav to Bethlehem with our

Blessed Mother and St. Joseph. As we travel, let us see that mountain of the Lord draw ever closer and feel rejoicing well up in our hearts to return to the House of the Lord.


