In November we Remember

Fr. Joe MacMahon. O.F.M.



On Saturday 29th October last Fr. Joe closed his eyes to this world as he journeyed to the home of the Father. He was 80 years old, born in Feenagh, Co. Limerick on May 21st 1942. He entered the Franciscan Novitiate in Killarney in 1960 and after studies in Galway and Belgium he was ordained to the Priesthood in 1970.

He requested to be sent to the missions and he was appointed to Chile, Bolivia, Zimbabwe, Zambia & South Africia. He pursued doctoral studies and put himself at the service of the Franciscans in helping in formation. On his return to Ireland he was assigned to different Friaries over a 22year period. In 2005 he was appointed Secretary of the Franciscan Province based in Merchants Quay, Dublin. In 2017 he was appointed Guardian of the Friary here in Ennis. During the pandemic, due to ill health Joe resigned as Guardian but continued to be a valued member of the Ennis Fraternity up to his death last weekend.

Joe served on our Pastoral Council and supported the Parish in many ways. He helped us promote Laudato Si (Pope Francis' message on the care of the earth). Joe was the first person to make the suggestion of a Columbarium for our Cathedral and lived to see this become a reality last November..

Joe lived faithfully his Franciscan calling. His contemplative soul and smile with his kindness and gentleness made him very approachable. He prepared for death with true Franciscan contentment in welcoming sister death on Saturday last.

His Funeral Mass took place in the Friary on Monday last and he was laid to rest with his Brother Friars in Ennis Abbey.

We offer our Sympathy to his sister Mary and his brother Friars who mourn his death and we thank them for blessing us with Fr. Joe here in Fnnis

As he welcomes sister death, may his gentle soul Rest in the Peace of Christ.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke Lk 20:27-38

Some Sadducees - those who say that there is no resurrection - approached Jesus and they put this question to him, 'Master, we have it from Moses in writing, that if a man's married brother dies childless, the

man must marry the widow to raise up children for his brother.

Well, then, there were seven brothers. The first, having married a wife, died childless. The second and then the third married the widow. And the same with all seven, they died leaving no children. Finally the woman herself died. Now, at the resurrection, to which of them will she be wife since she had been married to all seven?'

Jesus replied, 'The children of this world take wives and husbands, but those who are judged worthy of a place in the other world and in the resurrection from the dead do not marry because they can no longer die, for they are the same as the angels, and being children of the resurrection they are sons of God.

And Moses himself implies that the dead rise again, in the passage about the bush where he calls the Lord the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob. Now he is God, not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all are in fact alive.
