WHAT SHOULD I GIVE UP FOR LENT?

Wednesday next 22nd February is Ash Wednesday and the first day of Lent. Many of us try to be more disciplined for Lent and give up something that we really like. That's great! Fasting has always been an important tradition of Lent. This year however, let us also consider other things that we can give up.

Give up complaining Focus on gratitude

Philippians 2:14-15 – Do everything without complaining or arguing, so that you may become blameless and pure...

Give up bitterness Turn to forgiveness

Ephesians 4:32 – Be kind and compassionate to one another forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you

Give up worry Trust in God

Matthew 6:25 – "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life... who by worrying can add a single hour to his life?"

Give up discouragement Be full of hope

Deuteronomy 31:8 – The Lord himself goes before you and will be with you: he will never leave you or forsake you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged.

Give up hatred Return good for evil

1 John 2:9 - Anyone who claims to be in the light but hates his brother is still in the darkness.

Give up anger Be more patient

Proverbs 15:18 – A hot tempered man stirs up dissension, but a patient man calms a quarrel.

Give up gossiping Control your tongue

Proverbs 21:23 – He who guards his mouth and his tongue keeps himself from calamity.

Because observing Lent is so much bigger than what you "give up."

Lent 2023



Lent begins on Ash Wednesday this week. It is a time of reflection, penance and preparation for the celebration of Easter. We are asked to simplify our lives. Just as lent asks us to live simply as individuals, so it calls us to worship more simply as a community.

We will not pray the Gloria or sing Alleluia. There will be very little flowers around the Sanctuary. To help us concentrate on God's word proclaimed at the Ambo and Christ's sacrifice made present when we break the bread around the altar, everything else is put in the background.

Apart from the stations of the cross, all statues are veiled with purple cloth. The place will look more sober, stark even. There will be few trimmings, just the altar, the ambo and the cross. Our church will look a lot different from Ash Wednesday until Easter. Maybe as we see the change it will encourage us all to try and change ourselves for r

the better.



Ash Wednesday

Ashes will be blessed and distributed at all Masses on Ash Wednesday which is a day of fast and abstinence for all aged between 18 and 59.

A Day of fast and Abstinence

There are two days each year in the Catholic Faith that we are asked to fast and abstain on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting means that one full meatless meal can be eaten in the day. Two other meatless meals may be taken to maintain strength but together they should not exceed one full meal. Those in good health between the age of 18 until 59 are asked to observe the fast.

The earthquake in Syria and Turkey on 5th February have had a devastating impact on millions of people in both



Make no mistake about it; if any one of you thinks of himself as wise, in the ordinary sense of the word, then he must learn to be a fool before he really can be wise. Why? And if you save your greetings for your brothers, are you doing anything exceptional? Even the pagans do as much, do they not? You must therefore be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect.'
