World Day of Prayer for the Sick

On 13th May 1992, a number of years following an assassination attempt on his life that led to a time of suffering and the experiences of being seriously ill in hospital, Saint Pope John Paul 11 launched a world day of prayer for the sick which coincides each year with the Feast Day of our Lady of Lourdes on 11th February. Pope Benedict and Pope Francis have continued this special world day. It is a time to reflect on the needs of all who suffer, to pause and be prayerful in solidarity with those who experience illness and with all who care for those who are facing sickness.

The 11th February is famous for a few reasons, we know it is the date of the first apparition of our Lady to Bernadette and because of this it is the feast of our Lady of Lourdes, and since 1993 the day we celebrate World Day of Prayer for the Sick.

It was on 11th February 2013 that the recently deceased Pope Benedict announced his retirement, and back in 1990 it was the day that Nelson Mandela was freed from prison after 27 years. Two things that each of these events have in common is that they were occasions in various ways for both celebration and thanksgiving, occasions for joy and gratitude.

For St. Bernadette, there would have been celebration and thanksgiving that God has chosen her to be the one to see and talk with the mother of God. For those experiencing sickness across the world, there are feelings of gratitude that a day in the Church's calendar would be devoted to prayer and solidarity for those in need of healing.

For the late Pope Benedict there would have been feelings of gratitude that he could retire in his old age. For Nelson Mandela and the people of South Africa, feelings of Joy and Thanksgiving that his years as a prisoner has come to an end.



Amen. Our Lady of Lourdes, pray for us. Saint Gobnait's feast day is celebrated

on 11 February also. According to tradition she was born in Co. Clare but travelled to many places in Ireland including Baile Bhúirne, Co. Cork. She was esteemed as a healer, carer of the sick and is the patron saint of beekeepers. May God bless you Gobnait, may Mary bless you as I salute and bless you.
