Second Sunday of Lent (Year A) 5th March, 2023

Peter spoke to Jesus, "Lord", he said, 'it is wonderful for us to be here." There came a voice which said, "This is my son, the beloved, he enjoys my favour, listen to him."

The call of the Lord to listen to him was a central theme among the very large gathering of Parish Pastoral Council representatives in the Inn at Dromoland Hotel on Thursday 19th January this year as they sought direction on how best to nourish our parish faith communities in the face of many challenges in the coming years.

It was comforting to see so many people conversing and mapping out a fruitful path, in time for our Christian communities going forward.

Like the disciples on Mount Tabor, this listening to the Lord in the comforting presence of people of like minded faith was like a radio mast on top of a present day mountain broadcasting its waves back and forth in search of a deeper spiritual nourishment in parish and diocesan everyday life.

What the poet W.B. Yeats described as an "impulse of delight", in search of personal and spiritual fulfilment, our world is frantically searching for that inner radiance of a deep personal peace and fulfilment which the Lord offered the disciples on Mount Tabor and is similarly offering to you and me in our time.

Let us have our candles lit, our prayers offered as we assist the representatives of our Parish Pastoral Council in the Diocese of Killaloe to proclaim the Gospel, witness to that Gospel and assume our Christian responsibilities in everyday parish life.

This is not an option but rather our Christian calling in life. Why wait!! Why let others play your part and assume your Christian responsibilities.

In the words of Jonathan Swift -

"If when we practise our Faith we are not helping ourselves or our world, bringing people closer together, are we not just adding to the world's problems."

Think of the ordinary fisherman in the Gospel and cast out your nets.

The disciples were afraid and Jesus spoke to them "Arise" he said "and do not be afraid" On looking up they saw nobody only Jesus. May our faith be a source of hope and peace in our lives.
