The celebration of the wonderful Feast of Divine Mercy is again upon us. For a joyous and up-beat Catholic gathering please join us, in these often difficult times, bring someone who you know needs the boost and lift!

The Divine Mercy message of complete forgiveness and remission of all sins is guaranteed for all those who on Divine Mercy Sunday (or days leading up to it, St. Faustina herself, made her confession the Saturday before) receive sacramental confession and receive the Blessed Eucharist. Sr. Kathleen Cleary RIP



Sr. Kathleen Cleary died peacefully on Easter Sunday, 09 April 2023, in Cahercalla Nursing Home, surrounded by family members and Sisters of Mercy. Kathleen is the last of her siblings to die; her sister, Teena, was buried just one week ago; she is survived by sister-in-law, Marina, nieces, nephews, grandnieces and grand- nephews.

Kathleen Josephine was born on 9th January 1933, to Martin Cleary and Christine Buckley, at Coolbawn, Nenagh, Co. Tipperary. She was educated at Kilbarron NS and Mercy Secondary School, Borrisokane. She joined the Sisters of Mercy at St. Xavier's, Ennis, on 24 Sept. 1952 and was known for many years as Sr. Virgilius.

Having trained as a nurse in Portiuncula, Ballinasloe, Kathleen was appointed to the staff of St. Joseph's Hospital, Ennis in 1959 and on staff there until 1991. From 1982 to 1984 and again from 1991 to 1995 Kathleen volunteered to work in the Mercy Hospital in Mutomo, Kenya. On her return she spent five years in the Mercy Mission House in Athlumney, Navan, retiring in 2000 to Ardlea Close, Ennis.

Kathleen, who was a gentle, caring, generous woman, endeared herself to family, colleagues, patients and community companions; she was creative in many areas of art, painting, embroidery, flower arranging, gardening; all was done in a most unassuming, good-humoured, quiet manner.

Kathleen received her cancer diagnosis with extraordinary equanimity and prayerful acceptance. She moved to St. Xavier's in January and to Cahercalla less than two weeks before her death. It was poignant, but in keeping with the Kathleen we knew, to read in a personal note of hers:

'When God is calling me, let me go".

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John. Jh 20:19-31

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.'

'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit.

For those whose sins you forgive they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain,

they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him:

'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'

There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.
