Feast of the Holy Trinity

The Mystery that is God

The story of the Pastor preaching on this Feast of the Blessed Trinity comes to mind .. "Today is the Feast of the Blessed Trinity, I don't understand it, you're not supposed to understand it, it's a mystery .. Stand for the Creed" If only it was THAT simple.

Rublev's Icon of the Trinity:

They sit and they wait. There is room for me at the table but they will not force me to come. Theirs is an invitation not coercion. They are the community of God; the three-in one, the Divine Unity - in Father, Son and Holy Spirit. They are the circle of love. They show us what love looks like and what love feels like, because their very essence is love


One of THE great mysteries has to be the birth of a new born child. Not long after it's first breaths taken the conversation readily begins, who does the baby look like? Features assessed usually guided by the mind of which family the commentator belongs to. Having just two possibilities to work from can be demanding enough, so why might we surprised that with God we are asked to trust in the possibility that three sources might just about give us an insight into how God might be known.

Today, we are invited to see God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit Creator, manifestation of Love, abiding presence and we are called into their loving communion. As Creator, might we see God as the initiator, from where we might begin in our endeavors to know God, Know God's nature and God's desire for all that is created.

As Son, and manifestation of love, more significantly Divine love, wrapped up in God's willingness to give all to show the depth of that love, along the way reminding Disciples, then and into the future, "What I have done for you, you too must do for one another." As abiding presence, the promised Advocate, The Holy Spirit is the gift surely of a promised fulfilled ... "I will be with you always, yes, to the end of time."

As John O'Donohue notes, "Once you get a taste of God, nothing else tastes the same." And again, "That's what it's about – coming fully alive to the dream of the Divine within you."

May the dream of the Divine resonate within you and lead you ever more deeply into the life of the Trinity."

10. I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.

11. The names of those who promote this devotion will be written in My Heart, never to be blotted out.

12. I promise thee, in the excessive mercy of My Heart, that My all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Friday of nine consecutive months. the grace of final penitence. They shall not die without receiving their Sacraments.
