TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME Year A 10th September, 2023

"Love your neighbour as yourself"

The biblical readings of the Mass this Sunday converge on the theme of love in the community of believers. The Apostle Paul in the second reading says that the whole Law of God finds fullness in love, so that in our relationships with others the Ten Commandments and every other law and rule are summed up in these words: "Love your neighbour as yourself"

The Gospel shows that in the Christian community love involves a sense of mutual responsibility. For this reason if someone commits a sin against me I must treat them charitably and first of all, speak to them privately, pointing out that what they have said or done is wrong. This approach is known as

"fraternal correction": it is not a

reaction to the offence suffered but is motivated by love for one's brothers and sisters

St Augustine comments: "Whoever has offended you, in offending you, has inflicted a serious injury upon themselves; and would you not care for a brother or sisters injury?... You must forget the offence you have received but not the injury of one of your brothers and sisters."

And what if my brother or sister does not listen to me? In today's Gospel Jesus points out the the loving approach is a gradual approach. He demonstrates that we are responsible for each other in the journey of Christian life; each person, aware of their own limitations and shortcomings, is called to accept the advice of others and to help others along the way.

Jesus is showing us how to deal with those situations when people will not admit that they have done wrong. He is not pointing us to an anything goes spirituality or morality, but rather to a pilgrim faith. We try to journey in truth and in holiness, sometimes we wander from the path, and so we seek Gods mercy and forgiveness and try again

to walk the right way. Similarly when others wonder away we should in love try to help them back on the right path.

When someone hurts you, it's a reflection of their own pain, not yours. For a Christian there is always a chance to be forgiven, to change, to grow, sometimes we need to receive a helping hand from others to enact that change, sometimes we need to offer that helping hand even to those who have sinned against us.


