Sacrifice Yourself in Love for Others

An outstanding American Catholic lawyer named Carl Cleveland was also a permanent deacon. He was framed by the FBI in July 1979 and sentenced to imprisonment and fined \$3m. He was innocent. But he had to go to jail for 840 days before he was freed by the Supreme Court. It was only his faith in Jesus that sustained Cleveland throughout that ordeal. Carl came out of prison and became involved in full time ministry. He says: "When all appeared lost, I was rescued and returned to my family and friends and to a life more abundant than the one I left behind. I experienced God's loving embrace in my powerlessness and despair, in a way I had never imagined possible". He invites those who face overwhelming difficulty to surrender their anxiety and fears to a loving God who will bless their faith abundantly.

PAIN AND SUFFERING

Faith in Christ does not shield us from suffering or pain. In fact, scripture assures us that our faith in Jesus will often bring suffering. In today's first reading we here prophet Jeremiah lamenting, "I have become a laughing stock all the day; every one mocks me. For the word of the lord has become for me a insult, and derision, all day long".

Though our natural instinct is to avoid pain, yet when Jesus foretold his crucifixion, he linked his suffering directly to our discipleship. Jesus wants our idea of suffering and pain to be transformed to such an extent that we begin to see it as a positive way of life. Our human view of happiness as the absence of suffering, sorrow, and pain must give way to Christ's perspective. Following Jesus means denying ourselves and allowing Christ to work in both blessings and trials. It means choosing to desire whatever Christ desires. It means bearing suffering and persecution from the world like Jesus did.

While we cannot change some of the negative events that happen to us, we can change how we react to them. When we don't learn to deal with our negative setbacks properly, we get caught in a negative cycle which causes ourselves more damage. We waste time harping on what has happened rather than moving on. By learning to deal with setbacks in a positive way, we can then deal with life's big challenges more effectively.

A NEW DIMENSION OF LIFE

To be a Christian is to take off your crown and take up your cross; to move from confession of faith to practice of faith. It is to realize how precious God's love is. It is, in a word, to trust in the promise of Jesus, that the Father "Will reward each person according to what they have done". All of us are invited to be followers of Jesus. A disciple is not greater than his master. He has to walk in the footsteps of the master. He has to embrace the cross in faithfully carrying out the mission entrusted to him every day. Jesus looks at our hearts and invites us with love, to surrender ourselves fully as he did on the cross.

Father Diarmuid O Laoghaire SJ made a collection of more than two thousand prayers which were passed down orally by our ancestors in his book *Ar bPaidreacha Dúchais*.

It was published in 1975. The prayers are associated with every aspect of human life from rising in the morning to going to bed at night, among them, grace before and after meals, going to Mass, lighting and quenching the light, putting the child to sleep, lighting the fire, making bread, prayers for father and mother, the rosary and many others.

These prayers are very rich and foster a relationship with God. They show effectively how our ancestors lived in the presence of God. .Above are some examples.
