MISSION SUNDAY



The theme that Pope Francis has chosen for Mission Sunday 2023 is "Hearts on fire, feet on the move"

It is inspired by the experience of the disciples on the way to Emmaus. In his message for Mission Sunday, Pope the reminds us that the two disciples were confused

and dismayed, but their encounter with Christ in the word and in the breaking of the bread sparked in them the desire to set out again and proclaim that the Lord had truly risen. The Pope expands three images to illustrate the transformation that the presence of Christ made real: their hearts burned within them as they heard the Scriptures explained by Jesus, their eyes were opened as they recognised him and their feet set out on the way.

Jesus walked with the disciples. The Lord never tires of being with us, despite all our failings, doubts, weaknesses, and the dismay and pessimism that make us become men and women of little faith. Today, the Risen Lord still walks beside us, particularly when we feel disoriented, discouraged or fearful. The Lord is greater than all our problems.

After listening to the two disciples on the road to Emmaus, the risen Jesus, "beginning with Moses and all the prophets, explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself" (Lk 24:27). The hearts of the disciples were delighted. They later confided to each other: "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" (v. 32). Jesus is the living Word, who alone can make

our hearts burn within us, as he enlightens and transforms them. A cold heart can never make other hearts burn! They gathered at table. Jesus took the bread, blessed it, broke it and gave it to them. Yet at the very moment when they recognised Jesus in the breaking of the bread, "he vanished from their sight". Christ, who breaks the bread, now becomes the bread broken, shared with the disciples and consumed by them. He is seen no longer, for now he has entered the hearts of the disciples, to make them burn all the more, and this prompts them to set out immediately to share with everyone their unique experience of meeting

the Risen Lord. To bear fruit we must remain united to Jesus. This is achieved through daily prayer, particularly in Eucharistic adoration, as we remain in silence in the presence of the Lord, who remains with us in the Blessed Sacrament. "Stay with us, Lord!".

After their eyes were opened and they recognised Jesus "in the breaking of the bread", the disciples "set out without delay and returned to Jerusalem" (cf. Lk 24:33). One cannot truly encounter the risen Jesus without being set on fire with enthusiasm to tell everyone about him. Therefore, the resource of the mission are people who have come to know the risen Christ in the Scriptures and in the Eucharist, who carry his fire in their heart and his light in their gaze. They bear witness to the life that never dies. even in the most difficult of situations and in the darkest of moments.

So let us set out once more, enlightened by our encounter with the risen Lord and prompted by his Spirit. Let us set out again with burning hearts, with our eyes open and our feet in motion. Let us set out to make others hearts burn with the word of God, to open the eyes of others to Jesus in the Eucharist, and to invite everyone to walk together on the path of peace and salvation that God, in Christ, has bestowed upon all humanity.

Canon Dan Spaight RIP

Daniel Joseph Spaight was born on 18th October 1934 in the Parish of Cratloe. He attended the local national school; St. Flannan's College and St. Patrick's College, Thurles, where he was ordained to the Priesthood, in the Cathedral of the Assumption, Thurles on 14th June 1959 for service in the Diocese of Middlesbrough. He was one of 437 priests ordained in Ireland that year.

For the next 50 years Fr. Dan served Middlesbrough Diocese in various parishes and as Diocesan Director of the Lourdes Pilgrimage. In 2010 Canon Dan retired to Ennis where he lived in Ard na Greine and served as a supply priest in various parishes. He had a particular ministry in Oatfield Church and as a confessor in Emmanuel House of Prayer, Clonfert.



Canon Dan has been described as a kind and generous priest with a huge pastoral heart. He always made time for people.

On Wednesday 18th October, the day of this 89th birthday, he was laid to rest in Ballysheen Cemetery, Sixmilebridge. His funeral Mass was celebrated in the Cathedral, Ennis. To his sisters Mary, brother Seamus, nieces and nephews, we thank your for Canon Dan

who enriched our lives and by his priestly life led us to God. May his gentle soul, rest in peace.

Sr. Breda Naughton, St. Xavier's Convent, Ennis, and formerly of Tullig, Cross, Co. Clare, died peacefully on Friday 13th. Oct. 2023, in the loving care of the staff and sisters at Catherine McAuley Nursing Home, Limerick; she is pre-deceased by her parents, Patrick and Mary and survived by her sisters, Susan, Mary, Anne, Josephine, Carmel, Helena and Rosarii and her brothers, Francis, Patrick, Michael and Con.

Breda joined the Sisters of Mercy, Kilrush, in 1963. Her professional career was totally devoted to nursing: initially in the Kilrush, and Nenagh Hospitals. In 1975 Breda joined the Mercy Mission in Kenya, where she became a staff member of Mutomo General Hospital and later ministered in clinics in remote areas around Nuu and Nguutani until 1994.

On her return to Ireland Breda worked in St. Joseph's Hospital, Ennis, St. Camillus's Hospital, Limerick, and in Cappahard Nursing Home, Ennis, before she retired to Ardlea Close, Ennis, in 2010. She moved to St. Xavier's in 2019 and to McAuley House in 2021.

Wherever she went, Breda always brought laughter and fun to those around her. She was known as a most kind, caring and capable nurse, very generous with her time and skill and much loved by all. She was very close to her family and they were very much present to her, especially in her final illness and four of her sisters were present at her death.
