Listen

Last Wednesday October 4th we celebrated the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi that brought to an end the Season of Creation which Pope Francis introduced in early September with the theme 'Let justice and peace flow like a river'. During these past weeks we listened to our world and deepened our awareness of how each one of us is called to be a custodian of creation.

Today we hear that word again, listen. The first word spoken by Jesus in this weekend's gospel is 'Listen'. We do so during this month of October as we celebrate the month of Mission and another invitation to listen. Tomorrow, we celebrate the feast day of St. John Henry Newman (1801-90) who is very much a voice to listen to as he lived out his baptismal call. John Henry gifted us with a beautiful hymn 'Lead Kindly Light' which leads us on to sing our hearts out in praise of God. John Henry's gift as a writer was his way of being missionary. His words and thoughts have guided so many to listen to God's Word.

Also, this week we celebrate the feast day of Pope John XXIII who was guided by the Holy Spirit to call the Second Vatican Council which began on October 11 1962 in Rome. The Second Vatican Council reflected on the call to be missionary and rekindled the early church's emphasis that each baptised person is called to be missionary.

As Pope John Paul II remined us when speaking about mission he said that each generation is a new continent to be evangelised. As we listen to the Word this weekend may we use the talents given us to plant the seed so that we can sing out praise to God and live our missionary calling given in baptism.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew. Mt.21:33-43

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'Listen to another parable. There was a man, a landowner, who planted a vineyard; he fenced it round, dug a winepress in it and built a tower; then he leased it to tenants and went abroad. When vintage time drew near he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants, thrashed one, killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them. "They will respect my son" he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, "This is the heir. Come on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance." So they seized him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?' They answered, 'He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives.' Jesus said to them. 'Have you never read in the scriptures:

It was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone. This was the Lord's doing and it is wonderful to see?

'I tell you, then, that the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit.'
