## SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT (Year B) 10th December, 2023.

# To reflect the image of the messenger!

To know where we are going we so often have to go back to the beginning ..... This Sunday we are treated to that very focus. Where the news of Jesus Christ finds it's source with the Old Testament Prophet Isaiah .. "Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way. A voice cries in the wilderness: make his paths straight."

With Isaiah as the prequel to where John the Baptist takes up the story, he, the Baptist, sets about making a path straight for Jesus' arrival.

Rather than thinking that the story of the 'messenger' ends with John the Baptist, let's imagine this Sunday is an invitation to us .. An invitation ... to be a part of a new episode in this tale .. The tale of preparing for Jesus' arrival in the NOW! What might be our equivalent of John the Baptist's attire of camel skin and diet of locusts and wild honey. So often I think of John setting the scene for Jesus as one who rocked the boat as he prepared the way for the one who would turn the boat on it's head.

In this new episode, to see ourselves, cast in the role of the messenger preparing a way for Jesus in the world we live in , the community we live in, the family we live in, we may need to rock the boat and become a reflection of the messenger. A messenger that is God sent, as John Was, so are we .... We might be even surprised at the manner in which, family, community, the world we live in might take notice of the one who is ever present, in our midst, waiting to be greeted and seen. Jesus.!

#### A reading from the prophet Isaiah Is 40:1-5.9-11

"Console my people, console them", says your God. "Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for her crimes".

A voice cries, "Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God across the desert. Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley; then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken".

Go up on a high mountain, joyful messenger to Zion. Shout with a loud voice, joyful messenger to Jerusalem. Shout without fear, say to the towns of Judah, "Here is your God."

Here is the Lord coming with power, his arm subduing all things to him. The prize of his victory is with him, his trophies all go before him. He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes.

#### A reading from the second letter of St. Peter 2 Pt 3:8-14

There is one thing, my friends, that you must never forget: that with the Lord, 'a day' can mean a thousand years, and a thousand years is like a day. The Lord is not being slow to carry out his promises, as anybody else might be called slow; but he is being patient with you all, wanting nobody to be lost and everybody to be brought to change his ways. The Day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then with a roar the sky will vanish, the elements will catch fire and fall apart, the earth and all that it contains will be burnt up.

Since everything is coming to an end like this, you should be living holy and saintly lives while you wait and long for the Day of God to come, when the sky will dissolve in flames and the elements melt in the heat. What we are waiting for is what he promised: the new heavens and new earth, the place where righteousness will be at home. So then, my friends, while you are waiting, do your best to live lives without spot or stain so that he will find you at peace.

## A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark. Mk 1:1-8

The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah:

Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way. A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight,

and so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'
