Sr. Zita Reidy



In her ninety-sixth year, and after a short illness, Sr, Zita Reidy died very peacefully on Sat. 16 Dec. 2023, in Cahercalla Community Hospital, Ennis. Margaret Teresa was born in Cooraclare to Mary Gallagher and Michael Reidy, one of a family of seven girls and five boys. She joined the Sisters of Mercy, St. Xavier's, Ennis, on 24 September 1946 and took the name Zita.

Gifted with a happy disposition and wonderful sense of humour Zita cheerfully used her outstanding housemanagement and catering skills in Ennis, Killaloe and Spanish Point convents; she was renowned as an exceptional cook. She had spent twentyfour years in Spanish Point when that house closed in 2019. She was sad to move away from the people of the area whom she had grown to know and love and from the 'wild Atlantic' in which she was a year-round swimmer.

A generous supporter of missions abroad, both by prayer and practical help, her particular interest was the work of the Redemptorist Fathers; she was a keen promoter of their 'Reality" magazine.

Zita will be sadly missed for her cheerful presence and her willingness to always 'give a hand'! Her 'Advent' is over - may her gentle soul rest in peace this Christmas and always.
