SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT Year B 25th February, 2024

TRANSFIGURATION - MEETING OF THE HUMAN AND DIVINE.

The story of the Transfiguration unfolds on a mountain top. The significance of the mountain is a recurring motif in spiritual experiences throughout the Bible. Mountains often symbolise places of encounter with the divine, where individuals are called to draw closer to God and gain insight into His purposes. In this case, Jesus takes Peter, James, and John up a high mountain, where a remarkable transformation occurs. This radiant alteration signifies a glimpse into Jesus' divine nature, a revelation of his true glory. The Transfiguration serves as a confirmation of Jesus' identity and mission, a revelation of his glory that strengthens the faith of his disciples for the challenges that lie ahead.

The Transfiguration invites us to contemplate the mystery of Christ's dual nature as fully human and fully divine. In his transfigured state, Jesus offers a glimpse of his heavenly glory, affirming his divine identity. Yet, he also remains fully human, sharing in our humanity and entering into our suffering. This union of the divine and the human in Jesus Christ is central to Christian theology and speaks to the depth of God's love and solidarity with humanity.

Like the disciples, we may experience moments of spiritual clarity and revelation, where God's presence feels palpable and undeniable. However, these experiences are often fleeting, and we are called to continue following Jesus even when the mountain peaks give way to the valleys of hardship and doubt.

The Transfiguration reminds us that true faith is not built on fleeting experiences but on a steadfast commitment to follow Jesus wherever he may lead us.

Peter, James, and John came down the mountain again to resume normal living below in the plains of Galilee. Like them, we resume normal living after our spiritual experiences, but our contemplation of the words of Jesus and his light take us through each day as we remember, "it is good that we are here."

Second Sunday of Lent

On the second Sunday of Lent we see Jesus triumph over death and promising eternal life. In the readings today, we see two major events in the life of Jesus. God makes known to Abraham that his descendants will be blessed. Most Christians recognise recognised Abraham as father. The disciples were afraid and Jesus spoke to them "Arise" he said "and do not be afraid" On looking up they saw nobody only Jesus. May our faith be a source of hope and peace in our lives. Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves.

There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is

wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him'. Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus.

As they came down the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.
