Peace Be With You

The invention of the telegraph brought about a dramatic change in the field of communication. The stage was set for linking Europe with America, but the question was "What should be the first message to be transmitted to the New World?" Scholars and political leaders began the search for a suitable message or an appropriate quotation.

Finally, the choice was a verse from the Bible: "Glory to God

in the highest, and peace on earth to men of good will" (LK 2:14). The idea behind this choice was that if God's supremacy is acknowledged on earth, everything will go well with the world. Any attempt to dethrone and replace God with wealth, power, and fame will ultimately bring chaos. Further, the first telegraphic message emphasized another great truth: "God is the author and giver of peace". Peace on earth is possible only when we maintain a healthy relationship

with the Almighty which reflects on our fellow human beings.

Christ's greeting on his first appearance to the apostles was, 'Peace be with you!' To understand we have to recall the past and how the disciples with the exception of John, deserted Jesus, while He was being crucified. So, Jesus' greeting of 'peace to you' may well mean that you are part of Me. I am not going to accuse you and all I want from you is to

remember My forgiveness, turn away from the past, make a new beginning, and continue My mission. Christ is the Lord of peace because He is the one through whom humanity can be reconciled to God, their sins be forgiven, and the harmony between our souls and God be restored.

What does it mean that Christ is the Lord of peace? How does He give us this experience of peace? Is 26:3 "You keep

him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on you, because he trusts in you." We get peace as we keep our minds fixed on Jesus. If we want to experience peace in these difficult and hard times, the only way is if we keep our minds steadfastly fixed on Christ. We keep our eyes on Him, trusting in His word and believing in His word.

One of the reasons why we so often live without the experience of peace is because our minds are so filled with the news headlines, with posts

on social media and with the latest thing that we've heard from someone else, or with our own worries, our fears and our concerns. We are not filling our minds with the words of Jesus promising us peace that comforts us. Ps 119: 165 says "Great peace have those who love your Law; nothing can make them stumble". The presence of Christ is what brings peace. It is the Lord Jesus being with you that gives you peace.

A Man of God



The Church of Mary Immaculate, Corrib Drive, Shannon was full to capacity on Monday afternoon last 8th April for the Funeral Mass of Canon Brendan O'Donoghue, one of the Killaloe Diocese's best loved priests.

Canon Brendan served for 68 years as a priest, 22 years in this parish of Ennis and 36 years in Shannon with ministry in Galway, England and St. Flannan's College.

He arrived here in Ennis in April, 1966 and immediately immersed himself in parish life. He went on to be a founding member of Clare Social Services, now known as Clarecare, St. Francis Credit Union, Ennis Old Folks' Club and the Christmas Day Dinners in the West County Hotel.

One of his greatest achievements for County Clare was in 1979 when he spearheaded the fundraising drive called Clare Special School Projects which led to the building of both St. Anne's and St. Clare's Special Schools here in Ennis to serve the needs of children with special needs all over County Clare.

As Pilgrimage Director of the Diocese, his work enabled pilgrims visit places like Lourdes, The Holy Land and Rome. In his daily pastoral work he covered many miles and hours, celebrating Mass and Sacraments, visiting the sick and housebound and giving pastoral support to schools. But, above all, Canon Brendan was a Man of God, a priest at the service of people. Each day of his life he prayed, celebrated Mass, prayed the Rosary and spent an hour in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. His sermons were very well prepared and relevant to life and living. He was a priest who was always in demand, he was a man who had no enemies and the love of God radiated from him.

On Thursday 4th April in Ennis Hospital he closed his eyes to this world. His presence especially in Shannon, where he ministered for the last 36 years will be missed, the personal touch with the man who never grew weary with life

One of his great phrases at the end of a meal was 'You will get no more here', so true now as his earthly life is now completed.

He was the first priest to be laid to rest in Shannon in Illaunmanagh Cemetery on the banks of the Shannon Estuary.

To his sister Maureen, brother Jim, nieces and nephews and their families, parishioners in Shannon and Ennis whom he loved so dearly, we offer our deepest sympathy and we thank, the O'Donoghue Family for blessing our parish and Shannon for 58 years and more for this wonderful Man of God – Canon Brendan O'Donoghue.

Today is the third Sunday of Easter.

In the gospel we see the two disciples on the road to Emmaus. They welcomed a stranger, who questioned them about the topic they were discussing. They told him the story of what happened to Jesus Christ and how he was crucified. Everyone was waiting for him to redeem Israel bécause he was an effective prophet in God's sight. They informed the stranger that the women had found the tomb empty and that an angel said that Jesus hand risen. He explained the Scriptures to them concerning his own life He was leaving but Cleophas invited him to stay. At the table he took bread , blessed it and broke it and gave it to them and left. They recognised Jesus and said to one another "Did not our hearts burn as He talked to us on the road, while he opened to us the scriptures? (Luke (24:32).

We often fail to recognise Jesus in our lives. The resurrected Christ is always with us. We should listen humbly to his word in the Scriptures. We can learn a lesson from Cleophas and his companion. They companion. welcomed the stranger. The Celts placed great emphasis on welcoming the stranger into their daily lives. It is part of our heritage that is worth reflecting on in this modern

world in Ireland.

rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they could not believe it, and they stood dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes.

Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms, has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.'
